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20	Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (19) and
21	paragraph (b) of subsection (31) of section 320.08058, Florida
22	Statutes, are amended to read:

24	(19) SEA TURTLE LICENSE PLATES
25	(b) The annual use fees shall be deposited in the
26	Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund in the Fish and
27	Wildlife Conservation Commission. The first \$500,000 in annual
28	revenue shall be used by the Florida Marine Turtle Protection
29	Program to conduct sea turtle protection, research, and
30	recovery programs. Additional license plate revenue, up to an
31	amount not exceeding 30 percent of the total annual revenue,
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1 shall be dispersed annually through the marine turtle grants program as provided in s. 370.12(1)(h). The remaining annual 2 3 use proceeds shall be used by the Florida Marine Turtle 4 Protection Program for sea turtle conservation activities. The 5 remaining annual use proceeds shall be used by the commission б for sea turtle conservation activities, except that up to 30 7 percent of the remaining annual use fee proceeds shall be 8 annually disbursed through the marine turtle grants program as provided in s. 370.12(1)(h). 9 10 (31) SHARE THE ROAD LICENSE PLATES.--11 (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to Bike 12 Florida, Inc., up to 25 percent the Florida Governor's Council 13 on Physical Fitness and Amateur Sports, a portion of which 14 shall be used for marketing and promotion of the "Share the 15 Road" concept and license plate. The remaining funds shall be divided equally between Bike Florida, Inc., and the Florida 16 17 Bicycle Association, Inc., to be used for: Education and awareness programs, for bicycle 18 1. 19 safety and motorist safety, with emphasis on sharing the 20 roadway by all users. Training, workshops, educational materials, and 21 2. media events. 22 The promotion of safe bicycling. 23 3. 24 Section 2. Subsection (6) is added to section 320.084, 25 Florida Statutes, to read: 320.084 Free motor vehicle license plate to certain 26 27 disabled veterans.--28 (6) A disabled veteran who has received a free license 29 plate under this section may purchase additional disabled veterans license plates. The cost for additional plates may 30 31 not exceed the cost provided in s. 320.06(1)(b). 2

Section 320.0848, Florida Statutes, is 2 amended to read: 3 320.0848 Persons who have disabilities; issuance of 4 disabled parking permits; temporary permits; permits for 5 certain providers of transportation services to persons who б have disabilities. --7 (1)(a) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor 8 Vehicles or its authorized agents shall, upon application and 9 receipt of the fee, issue a disabled parking permit for a 10 period of up to 4 years, which period ends on the applicant's 11 birthday, to any person who has long-term mobility impairment, or a temporary disabled parking permit not to exceed 1 year to 12 13 any person who has a temporary mobility impairment. 14 (b)1. The person must be currently certified as being legally blind or as having any of the following disabilities 15 that render him or her unable to walk 200 feet without 16 17 stopping to rest: Inability to walk without the use of or assistance 18 a. 19 from a brace, cane, crutch, prosthetic device, or other 20 assistive device, or without the assistance of another person. 21 If the assistive device significantly restores the person's 22 ability to walk to the extent that the person can walk without severe limitation, the person is not eligible for the 23 24 exemption parking permit. 25 The need to permanently use a wheelchair. b. Restriction by lung disease to the extent that the 26 с. person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for 1 second, 27 when measured by spirometry, is less than 1 liter, or the 28 29 person's arterial oxygen is less than 60 mm/hg on room air at 30 rest. 31 d. 7	2. The certification of disability which is required
8	under subparagraph 1. must be provided by a physician licensed

11	licensed under chapter 463, by the Adjudication Office of the
12	United States Department of Veterans Affairs or its
13	predecessor, or by a similarly licensed physician from another

The applicant or the applicant's parent or 7 quardian; and 8 The employee of the department's authorized agent с. 9 which employee is processing the application. 10 (d) Beginning April 1, 1999, the Department of Highway 11 Safety and Motor Vehicles shall renew the disabled parking permit of any person certified as permanently disabled on the 12 13 application. (e) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor 14 Vehicles shall, in consultation with the Commission for the 15 Transportation Disadvantaged, adopt rules, in accordance with 16 17 chapter 120, for the issuance of a disabled parking permit to any organization that can adequately demonstrate a bona fide 18 19 need for such a permit because the organization provides 20 regular transportation services to persons who have 21 disabilities and are certified as provided in this subsection. (2) DISABLED PARKING PERMIT; PERSONS WITH LONG-TERM 22 23 MOBILITY PROBLEMS. --24 (a) The disabled parking permit is a placard that can 25 be placed in a motor vehicle so as to be visible from the front and rear of the vehicle. Each side of the placard must 26 have the international symbol of accessibility in a 27 28 contrasting color in the center so as to be visible. One side 29 of the placard must display the applicant's driver's license number or state identification card number along with a 30 31 warning that the applicant must have such identification at 5

1 all times while using the parking permit. A validation sticker 2 must also be issued with each disabled parking permit, showing 3 the month and year of expiration on each side of the placard. Validation stickers must be of the size specified by the 4 5 Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles and must be б affixed to the disabled parking permits. The disabled parking 7 permits must use the same colors as license plate validations. 8 (b) License plates issued under ss. 320.084, 320.0842, 320.0843, and 320.0845 are valid for the same parking 9 10 privileges and other privileges provided under ss. 316.1955, 11 316.1964, and 526.141(5)(a). (c) The administrative processing fee for each initial 12 4-year disabled parking permit or renewal permit shall be 13 \$1.50, and all proceeds shall be retained by the tax collector 14 15 of the county in which the fee was collected. 16 (c)1. Except as provided in subparagraph 2., the fee 17 for a disabled parking permit shall be: a. Fifteen dollars for each initial 4-year permit or 18 19 renewal permit, of which the State Transportation Trust Fund 20 shall receive \$13.50 and the tax collector of the county in which the fee was collected shall receive \$1.50.p> b. One 21 dollar for each additional or additional renewal 4-year 22 permit, of which the State Transportation Trust Fund shall 23 24 receive all funds collected. b. One dollar for each additional or additional 25 renewal 4-year permit, of which the State Transportation Trust 26 27 Fund shall receive all funds collected. 28 (d) The department shall not issue an additional 29 disabled parking permit unless the applicant states that he or she is they are a frequent traveler or a quadriplegic. 1 than two disabled parking permits except to an organization in 2 accordance with paragraph (1)(e). Subsections (1), (5), (6), 3 and (7) apply to this subsection. 4 (e) 2. If an applicant who is a disabled veteran, is a 5 resident of this state, has been honorably discharged, and б either has been determined by the Department of Defense or the 7 United States Department of Veterans Affairs or its predecessor to have a service-connected disability rating for 8 9 compensation of 50 percent or greater or has been determined 10 to have a service-connected disability rating of 50 percent or 11 greater and is in receipt of both disability retirement pay from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, he or 12 13 she must still provide and has a signed physician's statement of qualification for the disabled parking permits., the fee 14 for a disabled parking permit shall be: 15 a. One dollar and fifty cents for the initial 4-year 16 permit or renewal permit. 17 b. One dollar for each additional or additional 18 19 renewal 4-year permit. 20 21 The tax collector of the county in which the fee was collected shall retain all funds received pursuant to this subparagraph. 22 23 3. If an applicant presents to the department a 24 statement from the Federal Government or the State of Florida 25 indicating the applicant is a recipient of supplemental security income, the fee for the disabled parking permit shall 26 be \$9 for the initial 4-year permit or renewal permit, of 27 28 which the State Transportation Trust Fund shall receive \$6.75 29 and the tax collector of the county in which the fee was 30 collected shall receive \$2.25. 31

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1	<u>(f)</u> (d) To obtain a replacement for a disabled parking
2	permit that has been lost or stolen, a person must submit an
3	application on a form prescribed by the department and must
4	pay a replacement fee in the amount of $\frac{55}{1.00}$, to be
5	retained by the issuing agency. If the person submits with the
б	application a police report documenting that the permit was
7	stolen, there is no replacement fee.
8	(g) (e) A person who qualifies for a disabled parking
9	permit under this section may be issued an international
10	wheelchair user symbol license plate under s. 320.0843 in lieu
11	of the disabled parking permit; or, if the person qualifies
12	for a "DV" license plate under s. 320.084, such a license
13	plate may be issued to him or her in lieu of a disabled
14	parking permit.
15	(3) DISABLED PARKING PERMIT; TEMPORARY
16	(a) The temporary disabled parking permit is a placard
17	of a different color from the color of the long-term disabled
18	parking permit placard, and must clearly display the date of
19	expiration in large print and with color coding, but is
20	identical to the long-term disabled parking permit placard in
21	all other respects, including, but not limited to, the
22	inclusion of a state identification card number or driver's
23	license number on one side of the temporary permit. The
24	temporary disabled parking permit placard must be designed to
25	conspicuously display the expiration date of the permit on the
26	front and back of the placard.
27	(b) The department shall issue the temporary disabled
28	parking permit for the period of the disability as stated by
29	the certifying physician, but not to exceed 1 year.
30	(c) The fee for a temporary disabled parking permit is
31	\$15.
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1 (4) From the proceeds of the temporary disabled 2 parking permit fees: 3 The Department of Highway Safety and Motor (a) Vehicles must receive \$3.50 for each temporary permit, to be 4 5 deposited into the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund and б used for implementing the real-time disabled parking permit 7 database and for administering the disabled parking permit 8 program. The tax collector, for processing, must receive 9 (b) 10 \$2.50 for each temporary permit. 11 (C) The remainder must be distributed monthly as follows: 12 To the Florida Governor's Alliance for the 13 1. Employment of Disabled Citizens for the purpose of improving 14 employment and training opportunities for persons who have 15 disabilities, with special emphasis on removing transportation 16 17 barriers, \$4. These fees must be deposited into the 18 Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund for transfer to the 19 Florida Governor's Alliance for Employment of Disabled 20 Citizens. 2. To the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund to 21 22 be used for funding matching grants to counties for the purpose of improving transportation of persons who have 23 24 disabilities, \$5. 25 (5) The applications for disabled parking permits and temporary disabled parking permits are official state 26 27 documents. The following statement must appear on each 28 application form immediately below the physician's signature 29 and immediately below the applicant's signature: "Knowingly providing false information on this application is a 30 31 misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 9

775.082, Florida Statutes, or s. 775.083, Florida Statutes.
 The penalty is up to 1 year in jail or a fine of \$1,000, or
 both."

4 (6) Any person who knowingly makes a false or
5 misleading statement in an application or certification under
6 this section commits a misdemeanor of the first degree,
7 punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

8 (7) Any person who fraudulently obtains or unlawfully 9 displays a disabled parking permit that belongs to another 10 person while occupying a disabled parking space or an access 11 aisle as defined in s. 316.1955 while the owner of the permit is not being transported in the vehicle or who uses an 12 unauthorized replica of such a disabled parking permit with 13 the intent to deceive is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second 14 degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. 15

16 (8) A law enforcement officer may confiscate the 17 disabled parking permit from any person who fraudulently 18 obtains or unlawfully uses such a permit. A law enforcement 19 officer may confiscate any disabled parking permit that is 20 expired, reported as lost or stolen, or defaced, or that does 21 not display a personal identification number.

(a) Beginning April 1, 1999, The permit number of each 22 confiscated permit must be submitted to the Department of 23 24 Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, and the fact that the permit has been confiscated must be noted on the 25 permitholder's record. If two permits issued to the same 26 person have been confiscated, the Department of Highway Safety 27 and Motor Vehicles shall refer the information to the Florida 28 29 Abuse Hotline for an investigation of potential abuse, 30 neglect, or exploitation of the permit owner.

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1	(b) A confiscated permit must be held as evidence
2	until a judicial decision about the violation has been made.
3	After a finding of guilt has been made or a plea of nolo
4	contendere has been entered, the charging agency shall destroy
5	the confiscated permit. A confiscated permit may not, under
6	any circumstances, be returned to its registered owner after a
7	finding of guilt has been made or a plea of nolo contendere
8	has been entered in court. The permit number of each destroyed
9	permit must be reported to the department, and the department
10	must record in the real-time disabled parking permit database
11	that the permit has been invalidated.
12	(9) A violation of this section is grounds for
13	disciplinary action under s. 458.331, s. 459.015, s. 460.413,
14	or s. 461.013, as applicable.
15	(10) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor
16	Vehicles shall adopt rules to administer this section.
17	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000.

20	<u>CS/SB 202</u>
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22	Provides that certain revenues from sale of the Sea Turtle License Plate shall be used for sea turtle conservation
23	activities.
24	Provides that revenues from sale of the Share the Road License Plate shall be distributed to Bike Florida, Inc.
25	Provides that a disabled veteran may purchase additional disabled veterans' license plates at the cost provided in
26	disabled veterans' license plates at the cost provided in statute. (Current fee is \$10).
27	Deletes the fee increase for a temporary disabled parking
28	permit.
29 20	Creates a \$1.50 administrative assessment fee to replace the portion of the \$15 fee for a disabled parking permit that
30 21	currently goes to the Tax Collector.
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
