18	Section 10. <u>The Division of State Group Insurance of</u>		
19	<u>the Department of Management Services shall develop a program</u>		
20	<u>to subsidize health insurance coverage for children of state</u>		
21	<u>employees if funds are made available for this purpose in the</u>		
22	<u>General Appropriations Act. Premium subsidies must be</u>		
23	<u>available only to state employees who have children under 19</u>		
24	<u>years of age and whose family income is equal to or below 200</u>		
25	<u>percent of the federal poverty level. Family premiums must be</u>		
26	<u>the same as those currently provided in the Healthy Kids</u>		
27	<u>Program for nonstate employees. The Division of State Group</u>		
28	<u>Insurance of the Department of Management Services and the</u>		
29	<u>Florida Healthy Kids Corporation shall monitor the</u>		
30	<u>administration of the program to provide state-funded coverage</u>		
31	<u>to eligible state employees through the Florida Healthy Kids</u>		

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1 Corporation and shall submit a report by January 1, 2001, to
2 the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of
3 the House of Representatives with recommendations as to
4 whether the program should be improved or could be
5 administered in a more cost-effective manner.
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
