Paragraph (ggg) is added to subsection (7) 12 of section 212.08, Florida Statutes, to read: 13 212.08 Sales, rental, use, consumption, distribution, 14 and storage tax; specified exemptions. -- The sale at retail, the rental, the use, the consumption, the distribution, and 15 16 the storage to be used or consumed in this state of the following are hereby specifically exempt from the tax imposed 17 18 by this chapter. 19 (7) MISCELLANEOUS EXEMPTIONS.--20 (ggg) Teachers and educational support employees .--21 1. Purchases by any person employed as a teacher in a 22 public or private elementary or secondary school in this state, or by any person employed as an educational support 23 employee in such a school, are exempt from the tax imposed by 24 this chapter. As used in this paragraph, "educational support 25 26 employee" means any person as described in s. 231.3605(1)(a) 27 employed by a public elementary or secondary school, or a 28 person holding an equivalent position employed by a private 29 elementary or secondary school. The department shall provide by rule for issuance 30 2. of a consumer certificate of exemption to any person qualified 31 1

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for exemption under this paragraph. The certificate shall be issued without charge and shall be of such size as to be capable of being carried in a wallet or billfold. Exemptions provided to any entity by this subsection shall not б inure to any transaction otherwise taxable under this chapter when payment is made by a representative or employee of such entity by any means, including, but not limited to, cash, check, or credit card even when that representative or employee is subsequently reimbursed by such entity. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000.
