Present subsection (8) of section 943.14, Florida Statutes, is redesignated as subsection (9), and a new 13 subsection (8) is added to that section to read: 14 943.14 Criminal justice training schools; certificates 15 and diplomas; exemptions; injunctive relief; fines .--16 (8)(a) Each criminal-justice-training school that 17 provides law enforcement, correctional, or correctional 18 19 probation officer basic-recruit training, or each selection 20 center that provides applicant screening for 21 criminal-justice-training schools, shall conduct a background 22 check of each applicant before the applicant enters the basic-recruit class. A complete set of fingerprints shall be 23 taken by an authorized criminal-justice agency or by an 24 25 employee of the school or selection center who is trained to take fingerprints. The school or selection center shall submit 26 27 the fingerprints to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement 28 for a statewide criminal-history check and shall also submit the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a 29 30 national criminal-history check. 31

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1 (b) Applicants who have been found guilty of a crime 2 that would render them unable to meet the minimum 3 qualifications for employment as an officer pursuant to s. 4 943.13(4) shall be removed from the pool of qualified 5 candidates. б Section 2. Paragraph (q) is added to subsection (1) of 7 section 943.17, Florida Statutes, to read: 943.17 Basic recruit, advanced, and career development 8 9 training programs; participation; cost; evaluation. -- The 10 commission shall, by rule, design, implement, maintain, 11 evaluate, and revise job-related curricula and performance standards for basic recruit, advanced, and career development 12 13 training programs and courses. The rules shall include, but 14 are not limited to, a methodology to assess relevance of the 15 subject matter to the job, student performance, and instructor 16 competency. 17 (1) The commission shall: (g) Assure that entrance into the 18 19 basic-recruit-training program for law enforcement, 20 correctional, and correctional probation officers is limited to persons who have passed a basic-skills examination and 21 22 assessment instrument based on a job-task analysis in each discipline and adopted by the commission. 23 24 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2000. 25 26 27 SENATE SUMMARY Requires a background check of applicants for basic-recruit training and requires basic-recruit 28 29 candidates to pass a basic-skills examination. 30 31

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
