Paragraph (e) is added to subsection (2) of 12 section 339.175, Florida Statutes, to read: 13 339.175 Metropolitan planning organization.--It is the 14 intent of the Legislature to encourage and promote the safe and efficient management, operation, and development of 15 16 surface transportation systems that will serve the mobility needs of people and freight within and through urbanized areas 17 of this state while minimizing transportation-related fuel 18 19 consumption and air pollution. To accomplish these objectives, 20 metropolitan planning organizations, referred to in this section as M.P.O.'s, shall develop, in cooperation with the 21 22 state and public transit operators, transportation plans and programs for metropolitan areas. The plans and programs for 23 each metropolitan area must provide for the development and 24 25 integrated management and operation of transportation systems 26 and facilities, including pedestrian walkways and bicycle 27 transportation facilities that will function as an intermodal 28 transportation system for the metropolitan area. The process 29 for developing such plans and programs shall provide for consideration of all modes of transportation and shall be 30 continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive, to the degree 31

appropriate, based on the complexity of the transportation problems to be addressed. (2) VOTING MEMBERSHIP.--(e) Any other provision of this section to the contrary notwithstanding, an M.P.O. whose jurisdiction encompasses all of three counties may have a total of 21 voting members, which shall include officials of agencies created by statute or under the authority of a municipal charter that operate or administer a major mode of transportation by air, without regard to whether such agencies are under the jurisdiction of a general-purpose local government. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. HOUSE SUMMARY Authorizes metropolitan planning organizations that encompass all of three counties to have 21 voting members, including officials of specified air transportation agencies.
