II. Summary of Amendments Contained in Message

House Amendment 1-Major changes:

School grading system :

Eliminates attendance as well as discipline for the next school year.

Discipline:

Amends the definition of suspension

Revises notice requirements to conform to zero tolerance changes.

Zero tolerance

requires one year expulsion for bringing weapon or firearm to school and school functions and for making bomb threats or false reports

Provides for assignment during expulsion

Provides for superintendent discretion in considering expulsion

Teachers

provides for additional authority to remove students from the classroom, as well as additional liability protections

School structure

Imposes size requirements on all new schools constructed.

School boards are encouraged to adopt policies for subdividing into schools-within-a-school.

Attendance

Modifies provisions for enforcing attendance.

Allows a law enforcement officer to take certain expelled or suspended students into custody, upon reasonable grounds.

Requires the law enforcement officer to deliver these students to specified sites.

Student support services

Creates pilot programs in 3 districts (Srasota, Lake, Miami-Dade).

House Amendment to to Amendment 1 - 951167

Hazardous walking conditions:

Allows districts to provide transportation to additional students who are subject to hazardous walking conditions.

Changes the composition and procedures for those who review these conditions. Provides for future funding to transport students because of hazardous walking conditions.
