Section 233.061(1), F.S., requires each school district to provide courses in the following subject areas: reading and other language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, foreign languages, health and physical education, and the arts. Furthermore, 233.061(2), F.S., requires teaching the following:

- Declaration of Independence
- Arguments in support of a republican from of government
- United States Constitution and its relation to government structure
- Flag education, including proper display and salute
- Elements of civil governments
- History of the Holocaust
- History of African Americans
- Elementary principles of agriculture
- The effects of alcohol and narcotics upon the human body
- Kindness to animals
- The history of the state
- Conservation of natural resources
- Comprehensive health education
- The study of Hispanic contributions to the United States
- The study of women's contributions to the United States
- Additional materials, subjects, courses, or fields as prescribed by law or rule

The Florida Legislature has amended the above list several times. Past changes include:

- 1999 Requirement of Hispanic and women's contributions to the United States
- 1997 Requirement that civil government instruction include the primary functions and inter-relationships between various levels of government; inclusion of

comprehensive health education; and removal of the specific requirement for teaching effects of alcohol and narcotics

1994 Requirement for instruction in history of African-Americans and of the Holocaust

Although the bill does not require new textbooks to incorporate these studies into the curriculum, publishers of textbooks do take into consideration required curriculums when they determine what to include in textbooks.

On April 24, 2000, SB 172 was substituted for HB 907 in the House and passed with a unanimous vote of 108 to 0, and was subsequently ordered enrolled. On June 5, 2000, SB 172 was approved by the Governor.
