WHEREAS, Connie Mack was elected in 1982 to the United States House of Representatives to represent the 13th Congressional District of Florida, and served in the House of Representatives for three terms with honor and distinction,

WHEREAS, Congressman Connie Mack was elected in 1988 to the United States Senate in one of the closest elections in the history of the State of Florida, and

WHEREAS, Senator Connie Mack was overwhelmingly reelected to the United States Senate in 1994, thus becoming the first Republican in Florida to be reelected to the United States Senate since reconstruction, and

WHEREAS, as chairman of the Senate Republican Conference, Senator Connie Mack is the third-ranking member of the Senate Republican leadership, and

WHEREAS, Senator Connie Mack and his wife, Priscilla Mack, both cancer survivors, have worked tirelessly to promote early-detection cancer programs, cancer-prevention programs, and innovative cancer treatment options, and have been recognized for their efforts by such organizations as the American Cancer Society, the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation, the National Coalition for Cancer Survivors, and the Don Shula Foundation, and Senator Connie Mack co-founded the United States Senate Cancer Coalition to heighten public awareness of the importance of cancer research, and
