Subsections (14), (15), and (16) are added 11 12 to section 400.141, Florida Statutes, to read: 400.141 Administration and management of nursing home 13 14 facilities.--Every licensed facility shall comply with all 15 applicable standards and rules of the agency and shall: (14) Before November 30 of each year, subject to the 16 17 availability of an adequate supply of the necessary vaccine, provide for immunizations against influenza viruses to all its 18 19 consenting residents in accordance with the recommendations of 20 the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, subject 21 to exemptions for medical contraindications and religious or personal beliefs. Subject to these exemptions, any consenting 22 23 person who becomes a resident of the facility after November 30 but before March 31 of the following year must be immunized 24 25 within 5 working days after becoming a resident. Immunization 26 shall not be provided to any resident who provides documentation that he or she has been immunized as required by 27 28 this subsection. This subsection does not prohibit a resident 29 from receiving the immunization from his or her personal physician if he or she so chooses. A resident who chooses to 30 receive the immunization from his or her personal physician

shall provide proof of immunization to the facility. The agency may adopt and enforce any rules necessary to comply with or implement this subsection.

(15) Assess all residents for eligibility for pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccination (PPV) and vaccinate residents when indicated within 60 days after the effective date of this act in accordance with the recommendations of the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, subject to exemptions for medical contraindications and religious or personal beliefs. Residents admitted after the effective date of this act shall be assessed within 5 working days of admission and, when indicated, vaccinated within 60 days in accordance with the recommendations of the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, subject to exemptions for medical contradictions and religious or personal beliefs. Immunization shall not be provided to any resident who provides documentation that he or she has been immunized as required by this subsection. This subsection does not prohibit a resident from receiving the immunization from his or her personal physician if he or she so chooses. A resident who chooses to receive the immunization from his or her personal physician shall provide proof of immunization to the facility. The agency may adopt and enforce any rules necessary to comply with or implement this subsection.

(16) Annually encourage and promote to its employees
the benefits associated with immunizations against influenza
viruses in accordance with the recommendations of the U.S.

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The agency may
adopt and enforce any rules necessary to comply with or
implement this subsection.

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Facilities that have been awarded a Gold Seal under the
   program established in s. 400.235 may develop a plan to
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   provide certified nursing assistant training as prescribed by
    federal regulations and state rules and may apply to the
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    agency for approval of its program.
