Section 409.9065, Florida Statutes, is 17 amended to read: 409.9065 Pharmaceutical expense assistance.--18 19 (1) PROGRAM ESTABLISHED. -- There is established a 20 program to provide pharmaceutical expense assistance to 21 certain low-income elderly individuals. 22 (2) ELIGIBILITY. -- Eligibility for the program is 23 limited to those individuals who qualify for limited assistance under the Florida Medicaid program as a result of 24 25 being dually eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid, but whose limited assistance or Medicare coverage does not include 26 27 any pharmacy benefit. Specifically eligible are low-income senior citizens who: 28 (a) Are Florida residents age 65 and over; 29 30 (b) Have an income at or below 150 between 90 and 120

31 percent of the federal poverty level;

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- 1 (c) Are eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid;
 - (d) Are not enrolled in a Medicare health maintenance organization that provides a pharmacy benefit; and
 - (e) Are not receiving prescription-drug assistance from the Federal Government; and
 - (f) (e) Request to be enrolled in the program.
 - (3) BENEFITS.--Medications covered under the pharmaceutical expense assistance program are those covered under the Medicaid program in s. 409.906(20). Monthly benefit payments shall be limited to \$150\$80 per program participant. Participants are required to make a 10-percent coinsurance payment for each prescription purchased through this program.
 - (4) ADMINISTRATION.--The pharmaceutical expense assistance program shall be administered by the Agency for Health Care Administration, in consultation with the Department of Elderly Affairs.
 - (a) The Agency for Health Care Administration and the Department of Elderly Affairs shall develop a single-page application for the pharmaceutical expense assistance program.
 - (b) The Agency for Health Care Administration shall, by rule, establish for the pharmaceutical expense assistance program eligibility requirements, limits on participation, benefit limitations, a requirement for generic drug substitution, and other program parameters comparable to those of the Medicaid program.
 - (c) By January 1 of each year, the Agency for Health Care Administration shall report to the Legislature on the operation of the program. The report shall include information on the number of individuals served, use rates, and expenditures under the program. The report shall also address the impact of the program on reducing unmet pharmaceutical

drug needs among the elderly and recommend programmatic changes.

- (5) NONENTITLEMENT.--The pharmaceutical expense assistance program established by this section is not an entitlement.
- (6) PHARMACEUTICAL MANUFACTURER PARTICIPATION.--In order for a drug product to be covered under Medicaid or this program, the product's manufacturer shall:
- (a) Provide a rebate to the state equal to the rebate required by the Medicaid program; and
- (b) Make the drug product available to the program for the best price that the manufacturer makes the drug product available in the Medicaid program.
- (7) REIMBURSEMENT.--Reimbursements to pharmacies participating in the pharmaceutical expense assistance program established under this section shall be equivalent to reimbursements under the Medicaid program.
- Administration shall annually notify each Medicare recipient of the pharmaceutical expense assistance program. The notice must contain a description of the program and a toll-free telephone number to call to obtain additional information concerning the program.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2001.

SENATE SUMMARY Revises the eligibility requirements for the pharmaceutical expense assistance program established to provide assistance to certain low-income elderly persons. Deletes a requirement that a participant be eligible for assistance under the Medicaid program. Provides that a participant must not be receiving federal assistance for prescription drugs. Requires that the Agency for Health Care Administration annually notify Medicare recipients of the program and provide a toll-free telephone number for obtaining information about the program. for obtaining information about the program.
