Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Short title.--This act may be cited as the "Dori Slosberg Act of 2001."

Section 2. Subsections (4) and (8) of section 316.614, Florida Statutes, are amended, present subsection (9) is redesignated as subsection (10), and a new subsection (9) is added to that section, to read:

316.614 Safety belt usage.--

- (4) It is unlawful for any person:
- (a) To operate a motor vehicle in this state unless each passenger and the operator of the vehicle under the age of 18 years is restrained by a safety belt or by a child restraint device pursuant to s. 316.613, if applicable; or
- (b) To operate a motor vehicle in this state unless the person is restrained by a safety belt.
- (8) Any person who violates the provisions of this section commits a nonmoving violation, punishable as provided in chapter 318. However, except for violations of s. 316.613 and paragraph (4)(a), enforcement of this section by state or local law enforcement agencies must be accomplished only as a secondary action when a driver of a motor vehicle has been

detained for a suspected violation of another section of this chapter, chapter 320, or chapter 322. (9) A law enforcement officer may not search a motor vehicle or its occupants because of a violation of this section. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2001. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SB 1288 The CS deletes provisions in the bill which would have made enforcement of safety belt requirements a primary offense for all ages, and provides for the primary enforcement of safety belt requirements for operators and passengers less than 18 years of age.
