This exemption is subject 19 to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance 20 with section 119.15, Florida Statutes, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from 21 22 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. Section 2. Effective January 7, 2003, section 1 of 23 this act is amended to read: 24 25 Section 1. Representations from members of the tobacco 26 industry which are submitted to the Chief Financial Officer 27 Comptroller under section 569.21, Florida Statutes, for 28 purposes of calculating the annual tobacco-settlement payments are confidential and exempt from section 119.07(1), Florida 29

Statutes, and Section 24(a), Article I of the State

Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with section 119.15, Florida Statutes, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

Section 3. The Legislature finds that the exemption from the public records law provided by this act is a public necessity because disclosure of the representations from the tobacco industry which are used to calculate the annual payments to the state may harm the competitive standing of companies within the tobacco industry. The Legislature further finds that if such information is disclosed, tobacco companies would be disinclined to provide to the state a full and accurate report of information that is required for purposes of calculating and verifying the annual tobacco-settlement payments.

Section 4. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect on the same date that Senate Bill ____, or similar legislation providing for the reporting and verifying of information from the tobacco industry, takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof.

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SENATE SUMMARY
