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A bill to be entitled An act relating to persons with disabilities; creating s. 413.402, F.S.; directing the Florida Association of Centers for Independent Living to develop a personal-care-attendant pilot program to serve persons having spinal cord injuries; providing for memorandums of understanding with specified entities; providing eligibility for pilot-program participation; providing for selection and training of participants and personal-care attendants; providing for assessment of participants for work-related training programs; providing for development of a plan for program implementation; requiring a report to the Legislature; providing for implementation by a specified date; directing the Department of Revenue to develop and implement a tax collection enforcement diversion program in specified counties; providing for coordination with the Florida Association of Centers for Independent Living and the state attorneys' offices; providing for deposit and use of funds collected; directing the Revenue Estimating Conference to make certain annual projections; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date. Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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1 Section 1. Section 413.402, Florida Statutes, is 2 created to read: 3 413.402 Personal-care-attendant pilot program.--The Florida Association of Centers for Independent Living shall 4 5 develop a pilot program to provide personal-care attendants to persons who are eligible pursuant to subsection (1). The 6 7 association shall develop memorandums of understanding with 8 the Department of Revenue, the Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program in the Department of Health, the Florida Medicaid 9 program in the Agency for Health Care Administration, the 10 11 Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation, and the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the 12 Department of Education. 13 14 (1) Persons eligible to participate in the pilot 15 program must: Be at least 18 years of age and significantly 16 17 disabled due to a traumatic spinal cord injury; 18 Have been determined eligible for training 19 services from the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the Department of Education; and 20 21 (c) Either: 22 1. Live in a nursing home; or 2. Have moved out of a nursing home within the 23 24 preceding 180 days due to participation in a Medicaid home and 25 community-based waiver program targeted to persons having brain or spinal cord injuries. 26 27 The association shall develop a training program for training persons selected to participate in the pilot 28 29 program which will prepare each person to manage his or her 30 own personal-care attendant.

- (3) The association, in cooperation with the Florida
 Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation, shall
 develop a program to recruit, screen, and select candidates to
 be trained as personal-care attendants.
- (4) The association, in cooperation with the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation, shall develop a training program for personal-care attendants.
- (5) The association, in cooperation with the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation, shall establish procedures for selecting persons eligible under subsection (1) to participate in the pilot program.
- (6) The association, in cooperation with the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the Department of Education, shall assess the selected participants and make recommendations for their placement into appropriate work-related training programs.
- (7) The association, in cooperation with the Department of Revenue, the Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program in the Department of Health, the Florida Medicaid program in the Agency for Health Care Administration, a representative from the state attorney's office in each of the counties participating in the pilot program, the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation, and the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the Department of Education, shall develop a plan for implementation of the pilot program.
- (8) By January 7, 2002, the association shall present to the President of the Senate and to the Speaker of the House of Representatives the implementation plan for the pilot program. At a minimum, the implementation plan must include the following information:

1	(a) A timeline for implementation, including the
2	expiration date of the pilot program;
3	(b) Estimates of the number of participants to be
4	served;
5	(c) The sites selected to implement the pilot program,
6	and the rationale for their selection;
7	(d) The anticipated amount of collections by county
8	for fiscal year 2002-2003 under the tax collection diversion
9	program;
10	(e) Cost projections for each component of the pilot
11	program; and
12	(f) Method for and costs associated with an
13	independent evaluation of the pilot program.
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15	The pilot program shall be implemented by July 1, 2002, unless
16	there is specific legislative action to the contrary.
17	Section 2. The Department of Revenue, in coordination
18	with the the Florida Association of Centers for Independent
19	Living and the state attorneys' offices in Duval, Miami-Dade,
20	Broward, Orange, and Hillsborough Counties, shall develop and
21	implement a tax collection enforcement diversion program that
22	shall collect revenue due from persons who have not remitted
23	their collected sales tax. The criteria for referral to the
24	tax collection enforcement diversion program shall be
25	determined cooperatively between the state attorney's office
26	in each county and the Department of Revenue.
27	(1) Twenty-five percent of the revenues collected from
28	the tax collection enforcement diversion program shall be
29	deposited into the operating account of the Florida Endowment
30	Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation, to be used to
31	implement the personal-care-attendant pilot program.

1	(2) The pilot program shall operate only from funds
2	deposited into the operating account of the Florida Endowment
3	Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation.
4	(3) The Revenue Estimating Conference shall annually
5	project the amount of funds expected to be generated from the
6	tax collection enforcement diversion program.
7	Section 3. The sum of $$250,000$ in nonrecurring funds
8	is appropriated from the Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program
9	Trust Fund to the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational
10	Rehabilitation for fiscal year 2001-2002 for development of
11	the personal-care-attendant pilot program under section
12	413.402, Florida Statutes.
13	Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2001.
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1	STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR
2	Senate Bill 1608
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4	Changes responsibility for developing the Personal Care
5	Attendant Pilot Program from the Department of Children and Family Services to the Florida Association of Centers for
6	Independent Living.
7	Broadens the criteria for persons eligible for the Personal
8	Care Attendant Pilot Program to include those persons who are 18 years of age or older and have moved out of a nursing home within the preceding 180 days to participate in a Medicaid
9	nome and community-based walver program targeted to persons
10	with brain or spinal cord injuries.
11	Requires an implementation plan to the Legislature by March 1, 2002 and provides direction for its content.
12	Identifies Duval, Miami-Dade, Broward, Orange, and Hillsborough counties for developing and implementing a tax
13	collection enforcement diversion program.
14	Specifies that criteria for referral to the tax collection enforcement diversion program will be determined cooperatively
15	between the state attorneys' offices in the specified counties and the Department of Revenue.
16	States that 25 percent, rather than 10 percent, of the
17	revenues collected from the diversion program will be deposited into the operating account of the Florida Endowment
18	Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation for implementing the
19	Personal Care Attendant Program.
20	Specifies that the pilot program will operate only from funds deposited into the operating account of the Florida Endowment
21	Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation.
22	Includes an appropriation of \$250,000 in nonrecurring funds appropriated from the Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program
23	Trust Fund to the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation for FY 2002-2002 for the development of the
24	Personal Care Attendant Pilot Program.
25	Makes a technical correction regarding the organizational placement of the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation in the
26	Department of Education rather than in the Department of Labor and Employment Security.
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
