Section 812.135, Florida Statutes, is 25 amended to read: 26 812.135 Home-invasion robbery.--27 (1)"Home-invasion robbery" means any robbery that occurs when the offender enters a dwelling with the intent to 28 29 commit a robbery, and does commit a robbery of the occupants 30 therein. 31
