Subsection (3) of section 581.184, Florida 14 Statutes, is amended to read: 15 16 581.184 Adoption of rules; citrus canker eradication; voluntary destruction agreements; buffer zone .--17 (3) The department, pursuant to s. 581.031(15) and 18 19 (17), may create a citrus canker host-free buffer area, 20 delineated by department rule, to retard the spread of citrus canker from known infected areas. In addition, the department 21 22 shall develop a compensation plan for the trees removed from 23 the buffer area. Compensation for the trees removed from nonresidential property within the buffer area is subject to 24 25 annual legislative appropriation. 26 Section 2. (1) The sum of \$45 million is appropriated 27 from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Agriculture 28 and Consumer Services, and the sum of \$5 million is 29 appropriated from the Citrus Trust Fund to the Department of 30 Agriculture and Consumer Services. These moneys shall be used by the department to compensate, in the amount of \$100 a tree, 31 1

Compensation may be paid under this 3 section only for the removal of trees located on residential 4 property. 5 The specification of a per-tree amount of (2) б compensation in this section does not limit the amount of 7 compensation that may be paid by another entity or pursuant to 8 court order for the removal of citrus trees as part of a 9 citrus canker eradication program. 10 Section 3.
