## I. SUMMARY:

The bill eliminates the requirement of the Department of State, Division of Elections to contract with a private entity to compare information in the central voter file with available information in other computer databases, including criminal records and records of deceased persons. The Division's obligation to notify the County Supervisor of Elections about certain persons who may be deceased or ineligible to vote is limited to situations where the Division has identified the ineligibility based on data obtained from other Executive Branch offices.

The bill allows a \$900,000 reduction in recurring General Revenue in the Department of State, Division of Elections.

The Department of State, Division of Elections currently contracts with a private entity to compare information in the central voter file with available information in other computer databases, including criminal records and records of deceased persons. The private entity attempts to check other informational databases nationwide. However, recent experience has highlighted problems in verifying the voter eligibility data collected by the private contractor.

#### C. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

The bill eliminates the requirement of the Department of State, Division of Elections to contract with a private entity to compare information in the central voter file with available information in other computer databases, including criminal records and records of deceased persons. The Division's obligation to notify the County Supervisor of Elections about certain persons who may be deceased or ineligible to vote is limited to situations in which the Division has identified the ineligibility based on data obtained from other Executive Branch offices.
