B. PRESENT SITUATION:

The Juvenile Justice Advisory Board is established by section 985.401, Florida Statutes, within the Department of Juvenile Justice. The board is comprised of seven members appointed by the Governor. The board is charged with several responsibilities. Among them are developing a methodology for evaluating juvenile justice program outcomes, publishing an annual report, and advising the executive and legislative branches of government on issues affecting juvenile justice. Prior to July 1999, the board was housed in the Legislature. Section 985.401, Florida Statutes, is repealed on June 30, 2001, unless reenacted by the Legislature.

The House Criminal Justice Appropriations Committee has tentatively approved a proposal by the Governor to reduce the Department of Juvenile Justice budget by 3 FTE and \$278,151 due to the anticipated repeal of the Board on June 30, 2001.

C. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

The bill repeals section 985.401, Florida Statutes, which establishes the Juvenile Justice Advisory Board and eliminates references to the board found in other sections of the Florida Statutes.
