This act shall take effect October 1, 2001,

31 and applies to actions pending on that date or filed after

that date. With respect to an action pending on October 1, 2001, prejudgment interest shall begin to accrue on November 1, 2001. SENATE SUMMARY Requires the court to award prejudgment interest in an action for personal injury or wrongful death in which the plaintiff is entitled to recover costs and attorney's fees. Prohibits an assessment of prejudgment interest against the state or a state agency, including a hospital operated by a governmental entity. Provides for the act to apply to cases pending on October 1, 2001, with interest accruing from November 1, 2001.
