A certificate may be issued by the supervisor of elections to each person completing such 31 2

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training. No person shall serve as an inspector, clerk, or 1 2 deputy sheriff for an election unless such person has 3 completed the training as required. A clerk may not work at 4 the polls unless he or she demonstrates a working knowledge of 5 the laws and procedures relating to voter registration, voting 6 system operation, balloting and polling place procedures, and 7 problem-solving and conflict-resolution skills. (2) A person who has attended previous training 8 conducted within 2 years before the election may be appointed 9 10 by the supervisor to fill a vacancy on election day.
