I. Summary:

The Division of Statutory Revision of the Office of Legislative Services is required, by statute, to conduct a systematic and continuing study of the Florida Statutes. The purpose of this study is to recommend to the Legislature changes that will remove inconsistencies, redundancies, and unnecessary repetition from the statutes; improve clarity and facilitate correct interpretation; correct grammatical and typographical errors; and delete obsolete, repealed, or superseded provisions. These recommendations are submitted to the Legislature in the form of technical, nonsubstantive reviser's bills. A reviser's bill cannot be amended except to delete a bill section.

This bill deletes statutes provisions that have been repealed by a noncurrent (past-year) session of the Legislature where that repeal or expiration date has now occurred, rendering the provision of no effect (an example would be a repeal set for October 1, 2000, by the 1994 Regular Session of the Legislature).

This bill repeals the following sections of the Florida Statutes: ss. 17.43(3), 20.2553(3), 61.182, 206.9825(2), 240.3835, 240.408, 290.0075, 290.009(2)(c), 403.8533(3), 442.001, 442.002, 442.003, 442.004, 442.005, 442.006, 442.007, 442.008, 442.009, 442.0105, 442.011, 442.012, 442.013, 442.014, 442.015, 442.016, 442.017, 442.018, 442.019, 442.020, 442.021, 442.022, 442.023, 442.101, 442.102, 442.103, 442.104, 442.105, 442.106, 442.107, 442.108, 442.109, 442.111, 442.112, 442.113, 442.115, 442.116, 442.118, 442.1185, 442.119, 442.121, 442.123, 442.125, 442.126, 442.127, 442.20, 442.21, 448.24(2)(d), 570.205(3), and 713.5955.

II. Present Situation:

The Division of Statutory Revision, under the authority and requirements of s. 11.242(5)(b) and (i), Florida Statutes, must remove repealed statutory provisions from the statutes text where the repeal was voted by the Legislature sitting in the current year; sections effectively repealed but

where that repeal was passed by a past-year session of the Legislature can only be omitted from the statutes text through a reviser's bill pursuant to s. 11.242(5)(i).

This bill will delete sections that have already been repealed by the Legislature by substantive legislation that the Division of Statutory Revision could not remove from the statutes text without the required inclusion in a reviser's bill.

VIII. Amendments:

#1 by Rules & Calendar:

This amendment removes from the reviser's bill the deletion of s.206.9825(2). The subsection scheduled for deletion was repealed effective 7/1/00, by a 1996 law. Repeals set by past sessions of the

Legislature effective for a later year must be ratified through a reviser's bill once the repeal date has passed in order for Statutory Revision to remove them from the books. It is being deleted because there is a member bill that addresses this section. (WITH TITLE AMENDMENT)
