In addition, the 13 member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of fires or direct supervision of firefighting units, 14 15 or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a 16 member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, 17 however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities 18 are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not 19 20 be included;

21 (c) The member must be employed as a correctional 22 officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's 23 24 primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and 25 physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, 26 27 or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command 28 officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; 29 30 provided, however, administrative support personnel, 31 including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and
