Prior to commencing prosecution under this section, 28 the state attorney must advise the person responsible for 29 support by certified mail, return receipt requested, that a 30 prosecution under this section will be commenced against him or her unless the person makes such delinquent support 31 1

This act shall take effect October 1, 2001. б SENATE SUMMARY Provides that a person commits a third-degree felony if he or she has, for more than 1 year, owed \$5,000 or more in support to a child or spouse whom the person knows he or she is obligated to support and fails to provide legally obligated support that he or she is able to provide.
