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22	Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 97.021, Florida
23	Statutes, is amended to read:
24	97.021 DefinitionsFor the purposes of this code,
25	except where the context clearly indicates otherwise, the

27	(1) "Absent elector" means any registered and
28	qualified voter who <u>casts an absentee ballot.</u> ÷
29	(a) Is unable without another's assistance to attend
30	the polls.
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1 (b) Is an inspector, a poll worker, a deputy voting 2 machine custodian, a deputy sheriff, a supervisor of 3 elections, or a deputy supervisor who is assigned to a 4 different precinct than that in which he or she is registered 5 to vote. 6 (c) On account of the tenets of his or her religion, 7 cannot attend the polls on the day of the general, special, or 8 primary election. 9 (d) May not be in the precinct of his or her residence 10 during the hours the polls are open for voting on the day of 11 the election. (e) Has changed his or her residency to another county 12 in this state within the time period during which the 13 registration books are closed for the election for which the 14 15 ballot is requested. (f) Has changed his or her residency to another state 16 17 and is ineligible under the laws of that state to vote in the general election; however, this pertains only to presidential 18 19 ballots. 20 Section 2. Section 101.657, Florida Statutes, is 21 amended to read: 101.657 Voting absentee ballots in person.--22 23 (1) Notwithstanding s. 97.021(1), Any qualified and 24 registered elector who is unable to attend the polls on 25 election day may pick up and vote an absentee ballot in person at the office of, and under the supervision of, the supervisor 26 27 of elections. Before receiving the ballot, the elector must present a Florida driver's license, a Florida identification 28 29 card issued under s. 322.051, or another form of picture identification approved by the Department of State. If the 30 31 elector fails to furnish the required identification, or if 2

1 the supervisor is in doubt as to the identity of the elector, 2 the supervisor must follow the procedure prescribed in s. 3 101.49. (2) As an alternative to the provisions of ss. 101.64, 4 5 101.647, and 101.65, the supervisor of elections may allow an 6 elector to cast an absentee ballot in the main or branch 7 office of the supervisor by depositing the voted ballot in a voting device used by the supervisor to collect or tabulate 8 9 ballots. The results or tabulation may not be made before the 10 close of the polls on election day. 11 (a) (3) The elector must provide picture identification and must complete an In-Office Voter Certificate in 12 13 substantially the following form: 14 15 IN-OFFICE VOTER CERTIFICATE 16 17 I, ..., am a qualified elector in this election and registered voter of County, Florida. I do solemnly swear 18 19 or affirm that I am the person so listed on the voter registration rolls of County and that I reside at the 20 21 listed address. I understand that if I commit or attempt to commit fraud in connection with voting, vote a fraudulent 22 ballot, or vote more than once in an election I could be 23 24 convicted of a felony of the third degree and both fined up to 25 \$5,000 and imprisoned for up to 5 years. I understand that my failure to sign this certificate and have my signature 26 witnessed invalidates my ballot. I am entitled to vote an 27 28 absentee ballot because I am unable to attend the polls on 29 election day. 30 31

10	returned as soon as possible so that it can reach the
11	supervisor of elections of the county in which your precinct
12	is located no later than 7 p.m. on the day of the election.
13	2. Mark your ballot in secret as instructed on the
14	ballot. You must mark your own ballot unless you are unable to
15	do so because of blindness, disability, or inability to read
16	or write.

It is a felony under Florida law 15 to accept any gift, payment, or gratuity in exchange for your 16 17 vote for a candidate. It is also a felony under Florida law to vote in an election using a false identity or false address, 18 19 or under any other circumstances making your ballot false or fraudulent. 20 Section 5. Paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 21 101.68, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 22 101.68 Canvassing of absentee ballot .--23 24 (2) (c)1. The canvassing board shall, if the supervisor 25 has not already done so, compare the signature of the elector 26 27 on the voter's certificate with the signature of the elector 28 in the registration books to see that the elector is duly 29 registered in the county and to determine the legality of that absentee ballot. An absentee ballot shall be considered 30 31 illegal if it does not include the signature and the last four 9

digits of the social security number of the elector, as shown 1 2 by the registration records, and the signature and address of 3 an attesting witness.either: a. The subscription of a notary or officer defined in 4 5 Item 6.b. of the instruction sheet, or б b. The signature, printed name, address, voter 7 identification number, and county of registration of one attesting witness, who is a registered voter in the state. 8 9 10 However, an absentee ballot shall not be considered illegal if 11 the signature of the elector or attesting witness does not cross the seal of the mailing envelope or if the person 12 witnessing the ballot is in violation of s. 104.047(3). If the 13 canvassing board determines that any ballot is illegal, a 14 member of the board shall, without opening the envelope, mark 15 across the face of the envelope: "rejected as illegal." 16 The 17 envelope and the ballot contained therein shall be preserved in the manner that official ballots voted are preserved. 18 19 2. If any elector or candidate present believes that 20 an absentee ballot is illegal due to a defect apparent on the 21 voter's certificate, he or she may, at any time before the ballot is removed from the envelope, file with the canvassing 22 board a protest against the canvass of that ballot, specifying 23 24 the precinct, the ballot, and the reason he or she believes 25 the ballot to be illegal. A challenge based upon a defect in the voter's certificate may not be accepted after the ballot 26 has been removed from the mailing envelope. 27 28 Section 6. 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1 (1) Absentee ballots must be returned to the supervisor of elections by the elector, either in person or by 2 3 mail. (2) If the elector is unable to mail or personally 4 5 deliver the ballot, the elector may designate in writing a б person who may return the ballot for the elector; however, the 7 person designated may not return more than two absentee ballots per election, other than the designee's own ballot, 8 9 except that additional ballots may be returned for members of the designee's immediate family. For purposes of this 10 11 section, the term "immediate family" means the designee's spouse or the parent, child, grandparent, or sibling of the 12 designee or of the designee's spouse. The designee must 13 14 provide to the supervisor the written authorization by the elector and a picture identification of the designee and must 15 complete an affidavit. The designee shall state in the 16 17 affidavit that the designee is authorized to return that ballot and shall indicate if the elector is a member of the 18 19 designee's immediate family and, if so, the relationship. The 20 designee shall also state in the affidavit that the designee 21 has not and will not return more than two absentee ballots for this election, other than the designee's own ballot and 22 ballots for the designee's immediate family. The department 23 24 shall prescribe the form of the affidavit. If the supervisor 25 is satisfied that the designee is authorized under law to return the ballot, the supervisor shall accept receipt of the 26 27 ballot. 28 Section 7. 2	any person who accepts, a pecuniary or other benefit in
3	exchange for distributing, ordering, requesting, collecting,
4	delivering, or otherwise physically possessing absentee
5	ballots, except as provided in ss. 101.6105-101.694, is guilty
6	of a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s.
7	775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
8	(2) Except as provided in s. 101.62 or s. 101.655, any
9	person who requests an absentee ballot on behalf of an elector
10	is guilty of a felony of the third degree, punishable as
11	provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

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2	SENATE SUMMARY
3	Redefines the term "absent elector" for purposes of the Florida Election Code to mean any registered and
4	qualified voter who casts an absentee ballot. Revises and simplifies information to be included on absentee ballot
5	certificates. Revises printed instructions to be enclosed with each absentee ballot. Requires ballot to be
6	witnessed and signed by a person who is not a candidate and who is 18 years of age or older. Provides that the
7	ballot is considered illegal if it does not include the signature and address of an attesting witness. Prescribes
8	the information that an absentee elector's designee must include with the ballot. Deletes the prohibition and
9	penalty against a person witnessing more than five ballots in an election. Repeals s. 101.685, F.S.,
10	relating to absentee ballot coordinators.
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
