Section 196.032, Florida Statutes, is 14 created to read: 15 16 196.032 Exemption of homesteads of law enforcement 17 officers, correctional officers, correctional probation officers, and firefighters disabled in line of duty.--18 19 (1) Every full-time or part-time law enforcement officer, correctional officer, correctional probation officer, 20 21 auxiliary law enforcement officer, auxiliary correctional 22 officer, or auxiliary correctional probation officer, or full-time firefighter, who has become totally and permanently 23 disabled in the line of duty and who, on January 1, has the 24 25 legal title or beneficial title in equity to real property in 26 this state and resides on that property and in good faith 27 makes that property his or her permanent residence is entitled 28 to an exemption from all taxation, except for assessments for 29 special benefits, up to the assessed valuation on the 30 residence and contiguous real property, as defined in s. 6, Art. VII of the State Constitution. Such title may be held by

the entireties, jointly or in common with others, and the exemption may be apportioned among such of the owners as reside thereon, as their respective interests appear. If a person who meets the qualifications set forth in this section is only one of the owners of an estate held by the entireties or held jointly with the right of survivorship and such person resides on the property, that owner is allowed the exemption. Except for owners of an estate held by the entireties or held jointly with the right of survivorship, the amount of the exemption may not exceed the proportion that the assessed valuation of the qualifying person's ownership interest bears to the assessed valuation of the entire property. This exemption applies to each apartment or mobile home occupied by a tenant-stockholder or member of a cooperative corporation and to each condominium parcel occupied by its owner, if the owner is qualified under this section. Before this exemption may be granted, the deed or instrument attesting ownership must be recorded in the official records of the county in which the property is located, and documentation of the qualifying owner's disability must be filed with the property appraiser in that county. The property appraiser may request the applicant to provide additional ownership documents to establish title.

(2) As used in this section, the term:

(a) "Auxiliary correctional officer" means any person employed or appointed, with or without compensation, who aids or assists a full-time or part-time correctional officer and who, while under the supervision of a full-time or part-time correctional officer, has the same authority as a full-time or part-time correctional officer for the purpose of providing supervision, protection, care, custody, and control of inmates

within a correctional institution or a county or municipal detention facility.

- (b) "Auxiliary correctional probation officer" means any person employed or appointed, with or without compensation, who aids or assists a full-time or part-time correctional probation officer and who, while under the supervision of a full-time or part-time correctional probation officer, has the same authority as a full-time or part-time correctional probation officer for the purpose of providing supervision of offenders in the community.
- (c) "Auxiliary law enforcement officer" means any person employed or appointed, with or without compensation, who aids or assists a full-time or part-time law enforcement officer and who, while under the direct supervision of a full-time or part-time law enforcement officer, has the authority to arrest and perform law enforcement functions.
- (d) "Correctional officer" means any person who is appointed or employed by the state or any political subdivision thereof, or by any private entity which has contracted with the state or county, and whose primary responsibility is the supervision, protection, care, custody, and control, or investigation, of inmates within a correctional institution; however, the term "correctional officer" does not include any secretarial, clerical, or professionally trained personnel.
- (e) "Correctional probation officer" means a person who is employed by the state and whose primary responsibility is the supervised custody, surveillance, and control of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or community controllees within institutions of the Department of Corrections or within the community. The term includes

supervisory personnel whose duties include, in whole or in part, the supervision, training, and guidance of correctional probation officers, but excludes management and administrative personnel above, but not including, the probation and parole regional administrator level.

- (f) "Firefighter" means any person who is employed as a full-time professional firefighter by any municipality or county, the state, or any political subdivision of the state, including authorities and special districts, and whose primary responsibility is the prevention and extinguishment of fires, the protection and saving of life and property, and the enforcement of municipal, county, and state fire prevention codes, as well as of any law pertaining to the prevention and control of fires.
- "Law enforcement officer" means any person who is elected, appointed, or employed by any municipality or the state or any political subdivision thereof; who is vested with authority to bear arms and make arrests; and whose primary responsibility is the prevention and detection of crime or the enforcement of the penal, criminal, traffic, or highway laws of the state. This definition includes all certified supervisory and command personnel whose duties include, in whole or in part, the supervision, training, guidance, and management responsibilities of full-time law enforcement officers, part-time law enforcement officers, or auxiliary law enforcement officers but does not include support personnel employed by the employing agency.

Section 2. This act shall take effect on the effective date of SJR , which amends Section 6 of Article VII of the State Constitution, to allow the Legislature to exempt from ad 31 valorem taxation on his or her homestead a person who was

totally and permanently disabled in the line of duty as a law enforcement officer, correctional officer, correctional probation officer, or full-time professional firefighter. SENATE SUMMARY Provides an exemption from the entire amount of ad valorem taxes for a homestead of any law enforcement officer, correctional officer, correctional probation officer, or full-time professional firefighter who becomes totally and permanently disabled in the line of duty.
