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listed, may consent to the medical care or treatment of a minor who is not committed to the Department of Children and Family Services or the Department of Juvenile Justice or in their custody under chapter 39, chapter 984, or chapter 985 when, after a reasonable attempt, a person who has the power to consent as otherwise provided by law cannot be contacted by the treatment provider and actual notice to the contrary has not been given to the provider by that person: (a) A person who possesses a power of attorney to provide medical consent for the minor. A power of attorney to provide medical consent for a minor executed after July 1, 2001, includes the power to consent to medically necessary surgical and general anesthesia services for the minor unless such services are excluded by the individual executing the power of attorney.
