24	person to have any counterfeit payment instrument in such
25	person's possession. Any person who violates this subsection
26	commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided
27	in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084, Florida Statutes.
28	(b) The printing of a payment instrument in the name

instrument with such name, routing number, or account number is prima facie evidence of intent to defraud. (3) This act does not apply to a law enforcement agency which produces or displays counterfeit payment instruments for investigative or educational purposes. Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2001. HOUSE SUMMARY Makes unlawful the counterfeiting of payment instruments with intent to defraud. Provides a third degree felony penalty. Specifies prima facie evidence of intent to defraud. Exempts law enforcement agencies for investigative or educational purposes.
