**I. Summary:**

This legislation re-creates the Florida Preservation 2000 Trust Fund effective upon becoming a law. The Florida Preservation 2000 Trust Fund, FLAIR #77-2-332, is administered by the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. This fund was last reviewed and found exempt by the Legislature in Chapter 97-140.

This bill re-creates the Florida Preservation 2000 Trust Fund and provides that it is no longer exempt from the Section 19(f), Article III, of the State Constitution.

**II. Present Situation:**

The re-creation of the Florida Preservation 2000 Trust Fund would allow for the receipt of the Commission's share of the Preservation 20000 bond proceeds for the purchase of conservation and recreation lands.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
