In order to implement reductions and other 19 changes in appropriations for the 2001-2002 fiscal year made 20 by Senate Bill 2-B, subsection (14) is added to section 21 216.023, Florida Statutes, to read: 22 216.023 Legislative budget requests to be furnished to 23 Legislature by agencies. --24 (14) For the 2001-2002 fiscal year only: 25 (a) By January 15, 2002, executive agencies shall 26 submit to the Executive Office of the Governor adjustments to 27 their performance measures and standards necessitated by reductions and other changes by the Legislature to 2001-2002 28 29 appropriations. Review, revision, and approval of such 30 adjustments shall be conducted pursuant to the requirements of subsection (7). 31 1

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1	(b) By January 15, 2002, the judicial branch shall
2	make adjustments to any performance measures and standards
3	necessitated by reductions and other changes by the
4	Legislature to 2001-2002 appropriations. Review, revision, and
5	approval of such adjustments shall be conducted pursuant to

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8	This subsection expires July 1, 2002.
9	Section 2. In order to implement Specific
10	Appropriation 346 of Senate Bill 2-B and notwithstanding any
11	proviso contained in Specific Appropriation 1235 of chapter
12	2001-253, Laws of Florida, if Federal Title IV-E earnings do
13	not materialize, the Department of Juvenile Justice is
14	directed not to transfer general revenue funds from Specific
15	Appropriation 1200 to Specific Appropriation 1235.
16	Section 3. In order to implement Specific
17	Appropriation 613 of Senate Bill 2-B, section 257.195, Florida
18	Statutes, is amended to read:
19	257.195 Revenue shortfalls; procedures
20	(1) In the event of revenue shortfalls which
21	necessitate budget reductions during any fiscal year, the
22	total appropriation for library grants from state sources
23	shall have the same ratable reduction as that applied to the
24	operating funds of the Division of Library and Information
25	Services or such reduction shall be at the discretion of the
26	Secretary of State.
27	(2) This section does not apply for the remainder of
28	the 2001-2002 fiscal year. This subsection expires July 1,
29	2002.
30	Section 4. It is the policy of the state that funds
31	appropriated to state agencies which may be used for
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1 state-employee travel be limited, until July 1, 2002, to travel for activities that are critical to the state agency's 2 3 mission. Funds may not be used to pay for travel by state employees to foreign countries, other states, conferences, 4 5 staff-training activities, or other administrative functions б unless the respective agency head has determined that such activities are critical to the agency mission. Travel for law 7 8 enforcement, military purposes, emergency management, and 9 public health activities is not covered by this section. The 10 agency head, or his or her designee, must consider teleconferencing and other forms of electronic communication 11 to meet the needs of the proposed activity before approving 12 13 mission-critical travel. 14 Section 5.
