## I. Summary:

The bill substantially amends the following sections of the Florida Statutes: 496.405(4)(c), 496.409(7), 496.410(15), and 496.419(9).

The bill eliminates certain restrictions on the use, allocation, and disbursement of funds deposited into the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services General Inspection Trust Fund, effective January 1, 2002.

## **II.** Present Situation:

Section 496.405(4)(c), F.S., s. 496.409(7), F.S., and s. 496.410(15), F.S. provide that registration fees deposited into the General Inspection Fund be used to pay the costs incurred in administering and enforcing ss. 496.401-496.424., F.S. relating to the regulation of those who solicit charitable contributions.

Section 496.419(9), F.S. provides that fines collected by the department under subsection (5) be paid into the General Inspection Trust Fund to be used to pay the costs incurred in administering and enforcing ss. 496.401-496.424 or s. 496.426 relating to the regulation of those who solicit charitable contributions.

## **III.** Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill eliminates the restrictions on the use, allocation, and disbursement of funds deposited into the General Inspection Trust Fund, effective January 1, 2002.
