I. Summary:

This bill substantially amends subsection 11.13 of the Florida Statutes to reduce the salary of the members of the Senate and House of Representatives to the level received in the fiscal year 2000-2001. The bill is effective upon becoming law and expires June 30, 2002.

II. Present Situation:

Members of the Legislature receive a salary increase equal to the percentage raise provided to state employees for the prior fiscal year. The raise is effective July 1 each year. For the current year, members of the Legislature received a salary increase of 2.5% on July 1, 2001.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The bill repeals the salary increase for fiscal year 2001-2002 awarded to members of the Legislature on July 1, 2001. The bill is effective upon becoming law and expires June 30, 2002.
