For the 8 purposes of this section, the following products or 9 publications are not newspapers as referred to in this 10 section: those intended primarily for members of a particular 11 profession or occupational group; those with the primary purpose of distributing advertising; and those with the 12 13 primary purpose of publishing names and other personally identifying information concerning parties to motor vehicle 14 15 crashes. Any local, state, or federal agency, agent, or employee that is authorized to have access to such reports by 16 17 any provision of law shall be granted such access in the furtherance of the agency's statutory duties notwithstanding 18 19 the provisions of this paragraph. Any local, state, or federal 20 agency, agent, or employee receiving such crash reports shall 21 maintain the confidential and exempt status of those reports, and shall not disclose such crash reports to any person or 22 entity. Any person attempting to access crash reports within 23 24 60 days after the date the report is filed must present legitimate credentials or identification that demonstrates his 25 or her qualifications to access that information. This 26 exemption is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act 27 of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed 28 29 on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 30 31

This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. ********** SENATE SUMMARY Provides for agents and employees of local, state, and federal agencies to have access to reports concerning motor vehicle crashes. Requires a person who receives any such report to maintain the confidential status of the report.
