(2) The employing agency of any law enforcement 4 5 officer shall have the option to pay the legal costs and 6 reasonable attorney's fees for any law enforcement officer in 7 any civil or criminal action commenced against such law enforcement officer in any court when the action arose out of 8 the performance of the officer's official duties and: 9 10 (a) The civil or criminal action is dismissed or not 11 prosecuted plaintiff requests dismissal of the suit; or (b) The Such law enforcement officer is found to be 12 13 not liable or not quilty. 14 (3) However, the employing agency shall pay the legal costs and reasonable attorney's fees for a civil or criminal 15 action commenced against a law enforcement officer who is 16 employed by a political subdivision of the state if the 17 18 action: 19 (a) Is resolved as provided in paragraph (2)(a) or 20 paragraph (2)(b); 21 (b) Arose out of the performance of the officer's 22 official duties; and (c)1. Occurred in response to what the officer 23 24 reasonably believed was an emergency; 25 2. Was necessary to protect the officer or others from 26 imminent death or bodily harm; or 27 3. Occurred in the course of the officer's fresh pursuit, apprehension, or attempted apprehension of a suspect 28 29 whom the officer reasonably believes has perpetrated or 30 attempted to perpetrate a forcible felony or the offense of 31 escape.

9	is employed by a political subdivision of the state, the
10	case is dismissed or the officer is found not liable or not guilty, and the case involved an emergency, imminent death or bodily harm, or the pursuit or apprehension of
11	an offender.
