A bill to be entitled

An act relating to Florida Academic Improvement Trust Fund matching grants; creating s. 236.1226, F.S.; creating the Florida Academic Improvement Trust Fund matching grant program; providing legislative intent; requiring the Commissioner of Education to specify certain procedures; specifying uses of funds; providing for disbursement of funds; providing for administration of funds; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 236.1226, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

236.1226 Florida Academic Improvement Trust Fund matching grants.--

(1) LEGISLATIVE INTENT.--The Legislature recognizes that private contributions can play a significant role in enhancing, enriching, and improving academic programs for all K-12 students in Florida's school districts and the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind. It is, therefore, the intent of the Legislature to provide each school district and the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind the opportunity to strengthen private/public partnerships by offering private donors the incentive of state matching funds for contributions that support the improvement of academic programs within public school districts and the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind.

(2) MATCHING GRANTS.--The Florida Academic Improvement
Trust Fund shall be utilized to provide matching grants to the
Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind Endowment Fund and
to any public school district education foundation that meets
the requirements of this section and is recognized by the
local school district as its designated K-12 education
foundation.

- (a) The Commissioner of Education shall specify procedures for the administration, submission, documentation, evaluation, and approval of requests for matching funds and for maintaining accountability for endowments and the proceeds of endowments.
- endowments established pursuant to this section shall be used at the discretion of the public school district education foundation or the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind for academic achievement within the school district or school, and shall not be expended for the construction of facilities or for the support of interscholastic athletics. No public school district education foundation or the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind shall accept or purchase facilities for which the state will be asked for operating funds unless the Legislature has granted prior approval for such acquisition.
- (3) ALLOCATION OF THE TRUST FUND.--Funds appropriated to the Florida Academic Improvement Trust Fund shall be allocated by the Department of Education in the following manner:
- (a) For every year in which there is a legislative appropriation to the trust fund, an equal amount of the annual appropriation, to be determined by dividing the total legislative appropriation by the number of local education

foundations as well as the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind, must be reserved for each public school district education foundation and the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind Endowment Fund to provide each foundation and the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind with an opportunity to receive and match appropriated funds. Trust funds that remain unmatched by contribution on April 1 of any year shall be made available for matching by any public school district education foundation and by the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind which shall have an opportunity to apply for excess trust funds prior to the award of such funds.

- (b) Matching grants shall be proportionately allocated from the trust fund on the basis of matching each \$4 of state funds with \$6 of private funds. To be eligible for matching, a minimum of \$4,500 must be raised from private sources.
- (c) Funds sufficient to provide the match shall be transferred from the state trust fund to the public school education foundation or to the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind Endowment Fund upon notification that a proportionate amount has been received and deposited by the foundation or school into its own trust fund.
- (d) If the total of the amounts to be distributed in any quarter pursuant to this subsection exceeds the amount of funds remaining from specific appropriations made for the implementation of this section, all grants shall be proportionately reduced so that the total of matching grants distributed does not exceed available appropriations.
  - (4) GRANT ADMINISTRATION. --
- (a) Each public school district education foundation and the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind participating in the Florida Academic Improvement Trust Fund

shall separately account for all funds received pursuant to 1 this section, and may establish its own academic improvement 2 3 trust fund as a depository for the private contributions, state matching funds, and earnings on investments of such 4 5 funds. State matching funds shall be transferred to the public school district education foundation or to the Florida School 6 7 for the Deaf and the Blind Endowment Fund upon notification 8 that the foundation or school has received and deposited 9 private contributions that meet the criteria for matching as 10 provided in this section. The public school district education 11 foundations and the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind 12 are responsible for the maintenance, investment, and 13 administration of their academic improvement trust funds. The public school district education foundations 14 and the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind shall be 15 16 responsible for soliciting and receiving contributions to be 17 deposited and matched with grants for establishing endowments for academic achievement within the school district or school. 18 Each public school district education foundation 19 20 and the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind shall be 21 responsible for proper expenditure of the funds received 22 pursuant to this section.
