## A bill to be entitled

An act relating to surgical first assistants; amending s. 395.0197, F.S.; revising a required component of internal risk management programs to include requirements for the use of physician surgical first assistants; creating ss. 627.64165 and 627.6572, F.S.; requiring health insurance policies to provide coverage for the medically necessary services of a physician surgical first assistant selected by the primary surgeon to assist in a covered surgical procedure; amending s. 641.31, F.S.; requiring health maintenance contracts to provide coverage for the medically necessary services of a physician surgical first assistant selected by a primary surgeon contracted with the health maintenance organization to assist in a covered surgical procedure; providing applicability to new or renewed policies and contracts; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 395.0197, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

395.0197 Internal risk management program.--

(1) Every licensed facility shall, as a part of its administrative functions, establish an internal risk management program that includes all of the following components:

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- The development of appropriate measures to minimize the risk of adverse incidents to patients, including, but not limited to:
- 1. Risk management and risk prevention education and training of all nonphysician personnel as follows:
- a. Such education and training of all nonphysician personnel as part of their initial orientation; and
- b. At least 1 hour of such education and training annually for all personnel of the licensed facility working in clinical areas and providing patient care, except those persons licensed as health care practitioners who are required to complete continuing education coursework pursuant to chapter 456 or the respective practice act.
- 2. A prohibition, except when emergency circumstances require otherwise, against a staff member of the licensed facility attending a patient in the recovery room, unless the staff member is authorized to attend the patient in the recovery room and is in the company of at least one other person. However, a licensed facility is exempt from the two-person requirement if it has:
  - a. Live visual observation;
  - Electronic observation; or b.
- c. Any other reasonable measure taken to ensure patient protection and privacy.
- A prohibition against an unlicensed person from assisting or participating in any surgical procedure unless the facility has authorized the person to do so following a competency assessment, and such assistance or participation is done under the direct and immediate supervision of a licensed physician and is not otherwise an activity that may only be 31 performed by a licensed health care practitioner. Moreover,

the primary operating surgeon may select a physician surgical first assistant in accordance with the guidelines of the American College of Surgeons from among the appropriately credentialed members of the facility's medical staff.

4. Development, implementation, and ongoing evaluation of procedures, protocols, and systems to accurately identify patients, planned procedures, and the correct site of the planned procedure so as to minimize the performance of a surgical procedure on the wrong patient, a wrong surgical procedure, a wrong-site surgical procedure, or a surgical procedure otherwise unrelated to the patient's diagnosis or medical condition.

Section 2. Section 627.64165, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

627.64165 Surgical first assistants.--A health insurance policy must provide coverage for the medically necessary services of a physician surgical first assistant, as defined by the American College of Surgeons, selected by the primary surgeon to assist in a covered surgical procedure.

Section 3. Section 627.6572, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

627.6572 Surgical first assistants.--A group, blanket, or franchise health insurance policy must provide coverage for the medically necessary services of a physician surgical first assistant, as defined by the American College of Surgeons, selected by the primary surgeon to assist in a covered surgical procedure.

Section 4. Subsection (40) is added to section 641.31, Florida Statutes, to read:

641.31 Health maintenance contracts.--

1 (40) A health maintenance organization must provide 2 coverage for the medically necessary services of a physician 3 surgical first assistant, as defined by the American College 4 of Surgeons, selected by a primary surgeon contracted with the 5 health maintenance organization to assist in a covered surgical procedure. If the use of contracted surgeons is 6 7 mandated for a specific procedure, the health maintenance 8 organization may also require that the physician surgical 9 first assistant be contracted with the health maintenance 10 organization. Payment to a hospital may not be reduced by any 11 portion of the payment to the physician surgical first 12 assistant. 13 Section 5.
