I. SUMMARY:

THIS DOCUMENT IS NOT INTENDED TO BE USED FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUING STATUTES, OR TO BE CONSTRUED AS AFFECTING, DEFINING, LIMITING, CONTROLLING, SPECIFYING, CLARIFYING, OR MODIFYING ANY LEGISLATION OR STATUTE.

CS/HB 1653 creates the Florida Keys and Key West Areas of Critical State Concern Wastewater and Stormwater Trust Fund (trust fund) to be administered by the Department of Community Affairs. The purpose of the trust fund is to fund wastewater and stormwater management construction projects in the Florida Keys and Key West Areas of Critical State Concern .

The trust fund is credited with state appropriations made by law, and with funds from state and federal grants. At the end of any fiscal year, any balance remaining in the trust fund shall be available for carrying out the fund's purpose. Unless terminated sooner, the trust fund will terminate on July 1, 2006. Prior to its termination, the fund shall be reviewed as provided in s. 215.3206, F.S.

The bill also provides criteria relating to the administration of the funds by the Department of Community Affairs, and it gives the Department rule-making authority for administering the provisions of the trust.

This bill takes effect on July 1, 2002, and must be enacted by a three-fifths vote of the membership of each House.

Because the purpose of HB 1653 is to simply create the trust fund, there is no fiscal impact on state or local governments.
