Section 104.091, Florida Statutes, is 20 amended to read: 21 104.091 Aiding, abetting, or advising, or conspiring 22 in violation of the code .--23 (1) Any person who shall knowingly aids, abets, or advises aid, abet or advise the violation of this code shall 24 25 be punished in like manner as the principal offender. 26 (2) Any person who agrees, conspires, combines, or 27 confederates with another person to commit a violation of this code shall be punished as if he or she had committed the 28 29 violation. 30 (3) Any person who knows of a violation of this code and gives any aid to the offender who has violated this code, 31 1

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with intent that the offender avoid or escape detection, 1 arrest, trial, or punishment, shall be punished as if he or 2 3 she had committed the violation. Subsection (4) of section 777.04, Florida 7 Statutes, is amended to read: 777.04 Attempts, solicitation, and conspiracy .--8 9 (4)(a) Except as otherwise provided in ss. 104.091(2), 10 828.125(2), 849.25(4), 893.135(5), and 921.0022, the offense 11 of criminal attempt, criminal solicitation, or criminal conspiracy is ranked for purposes of sentencing under chapter 12 13 921 and determining incentive gain-time eligibility under 14 chapter 944 one level below the ranking under s. 921.0022 or s. 921.0023 of the offense attempted, solicited, or conspired 15 to. If the criminal attempt, criminal solicitation, or 16 17 criminal conspiracy is of an offense ranked in level 1 or level 2 under s. 921.0022 or s. 921.0023, such offense is a 18 19 misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. 20 (b) If the offense attempted, solicited, or conspired 21 to is a capital felony, the offense of criminal attempt, 22 criminal solicitation, or criminal conspiracy is a felony of 23 24 the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 25 775.083, or s. 775.084. Felony of the second degree; 4 5 Burglary that is a felony of the third degree; or 2. б Felony of the third degree ranked in level 3, 4, 5, 3. 7 6, 7, 8, 9, or 10 under s. 921.0022 or s. 921.0023, 8 the offense of criminal attempt, criminal solicitation, or 9 10 criminal conspiracy is a felony of the third degree, 11 punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. 12 (e) Except as otherwise provided in s. 104.091(2),s. 13 14 849.25(4), or paragraph (d), if the offense attempted, solicited, or conspired to is a felony of the third degree, 15 the offense of criminal attempt, criminal solicitation, or 16 17 criminal conspiracy is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. 18 19 (f) Except as otherwise provided in s. 104.091(2), if the offense attempted, solicited, or conspired to is a 20 21 misdemeanor of the first or second degree, the offense of criminal attempt, criminal solicitation, or criminal 22 conspiracy is a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable 23 24 as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
