# I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Camp Blanding Management Trust Fund, FLAIR number 62-2-069, without modification. The Camp Blanding Management Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Military Affairs.

# A. PRESENT SITUATION:

# 1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

The Camp Blanding Management Trust Fund was re-created by Chapter 97-135, Laws of Florida.

# BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

Re-creating the Camp Blanding Management Trust Fund enables the Department to receive, spend and account for funds associated with operating, managing and maintaining the Camp Blanding training facility.

In the 2001-2002 fiscal year, the Legislature appropriated \$2,119,442.

# 3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The primary source of revenue for the Camp Blanding Management Trust Fund is the sale of nursery, forestry products and mining royalties.

Other sources of revenue are rent from TITAN rocket storage, refunds and reimbursements, interest earnings, rentals, sales, and concessions.

Total receipts for the 2000-2001 fiscal year were \$2,065,461. Agency estimates for the 2001-2002 fiscal year and the 2002-2003 fiscal year are \$2,046,000 and \$2,146,000, respectively.
