Paragraph (a) of subsection (7) of section 947.1405, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 12 13 947.1405 Conditional release program. --14 (7)(a) Any inmate who is convicted of a crime 15 committed on or after October 1, 1995, or who has been previously convicted of a crime committed on or after October 16 1, 1995, in violation of chapter 794, s. 800.04, s. 827.071, 17 18 or s. 847.0145, and is subject to conditional release 19 supervision, shall have, in addition to any other conditions 20 imposed, the following special conditions imposed by the 21 commission: 22 1. A mandatory curfew from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. The 23 commission may designate another 8-hour period if the offender's employment precludes the above specified time, and 24 25 such alternative is recommended by the Department of Corrections. If the commission determines that imposing a 26 27 curfew would endanger the victim, the commission may consider alternative sanctions. 28 29 If the victim was under the age of 18, a prohibition on living within 1,000 feet of a school, day care 30

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center, park, playground, school bus stop, or other place where children regularly congregate.

- 3. Active participation in and successful completion of a sex offender treatment program with therapists specifically trained to treat sex offenders, at the releasee's own expense. If a specially trained therapist is not available within a 50-mile radius of the releasee's residence, the offender shall participate in other appropriate therapy.
- A prohibition on any contact with the victim, directly or indirectly, including through a third person, unless approved by the victim, the offender's therapist, and the sentencing court.
- 5. If the victim was under the age of 18, a prohibition against direct contact or association with children under the age of 18 until all of the following conditions are met:
- Successful completion of a sex offender treatment a. program.
- The adult person who is legally responsible for the welfare of the child has been advised of the nature of the crime.
- c. Such adult person is present during all contact or association with the child.
- d. Such adult person has been approved by the commission.
- 6. If the victim was under age 18, a prohibition on working for pay or as a volunteer at any school, day care center, park, playground, or other place where children regularly congregate, as prescribed by the commission.
- 7. Unless otherwise indicated in the treatment plan 31 provided by the sexual offender treatment program, a

prohibition on viewing, owning, or possessing any obscene, pornographic, or sexually stimulating visual or auditory material, including telephone, electronic media, computer programs, or computer services that are relevant to the offender's deviant behavior pattern.

- 8. A requirement that the releasee must submit two specimens of blood to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement to be registered with the DNA database.
- 9. A requirement that the releasee make restitution to the victim, as determined by the sentencing court or the commission, for all necessary medical and related professional services relating to physical, psychiatric, and psychological care.
- 10. Submission to a warrantless search by the community control or probation officer of the probationer's or community controllee's person, residence, or vehicle.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002.
