An act relating to "Shaken-Baby Syndrome"; requiring hospitals and birth centers to give to new parents informational brochures concerning the dangers of shaking babies and young children; requiring the Department of Health to prepare the brochures; prescribing the contents of the brochures; providing that a cause of action against specified persons and entities does not accrue as a result of failure to give this information; providing for a fine for violations; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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(1) Every hospital that has maternity and newborn services and every birth center shall provide to the parents of a newborn, before they take their newborn home from the hospital or birth center, information concerning the dangers of shaking infants and young children.
