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#### I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute Trust Fund, FLAIR number 412302, without modification. The Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Legal Affairs.

#### II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

#### A. PRESENT SITUATION:

#### 1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 16.54, F.S., creates the Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute and the trust fund, and provides for its purposes.

### 2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The receipts of the Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute Revolving Trust Fund are expended for the costs incurred in establishing and conducting crime prevention training courses.

For the 2001-2002 fiscal year, the Legislature appropriated \$631,001.

#### 3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The primary sources of revenue are registration fees and the proceeds from the sale of goods and services to state government and agencies within Florida, as well as outside the state, for the training courses. The department is also authorized to receive grants and donations for this purpose. In the 2000-2001 fiscal year, \$546,534 was received in the trust fund for fees and the proceeds from the sale of goods and services for the training courses. Agency estimates for the 2001-2002 fiscal year and the 2002-2003 fiscal year are \$576,874 and \$606,318, respectively.
