# I. SUMMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Sale of Goods and Services Trust Fund, FLAIR number 702606, without modification. The Sale of Goods and Services Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Corrections.

# II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

## A. PRESENT SITUATION:

#### 1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

The trust fund is created by Chapter 98-349, LOF.

# 2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The funds are used to repair and renovate state housing or dormitories.

For the 2001-2002 fiscal year, the Legislature appropriated \$1,402,763.

## 3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

The major source of income comes from rent and utility payments from department personnel that live on state property.

Total receipts for FY 2000-01 were \$428,652. Estimated receipts for FY 2001-02 and FY 2002-03 are \$442,000 and \$396,000 respectively.

#### B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
