(2) The Department of Environmental Protection shall conduct a comprehensive authoritative review of the pilot programs under this section and the recycling grant projects under s. 403.71851. The review must include, but is not limited to, the appropriateness of maintaining, extending, or revising current programs and projects; the effectiveness of current programs and projects; and alternative techniques and strategies for managing end-of-life computers, television sets, and other electronic equipment. The department shall consult with persons knowledgeable about the regulatory frameworks and recycling and reuse infrastructures for electronic equipment throughout the world, including, but not limited to local governments, other states, other countries, electronic equipment manufacturers, and public and private recycling and waste management organizations. The department shall issue its report, recommendations, and proposed legislative changes to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by January 1, 2003.
