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12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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14	Section 1. (1) There is created within the Division
15	of Children's Medical Services Prevention and Intervention of
16	the Department of Health the Infant Screening Programs Task
17	Force. This task force is created to perform comparative
18	research regarding the infant screening programs currently
19	operating in other states. The task force consists of 15
20	members as follows:
21	(a) All members of the Genetics and Infant Screening
22	Advisory Council;
23	(b) One member of the Florida Hospital Association
24	designated by the executive director of the association;
25	(c) One member of the Florida Statutory Teaching
26	Hospital Council designated by the chair of the council; and
27	(d) One representative from the Florida chapter of the
28	March of Dimes appointed by the head of the Florida chapter.
29	(2)(a) The first meeting of the task force shall be
30	held in Tallahassee by May 1, 2002.
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- Advisory Council shall serve as the chair of the task force.

 All decisions of the task force shall be by majority vote of the members present at a duly convened meeting of the task force. All meetings and records of the task force are subject to the requirements of Article I, section 24 of the State Constitution.
- (c) Members of the task force that are members of the Genetics and Infant Screening Advisory Council shall receive per diem as provided in section 112.061, Florida Statutes; other members of the task force must pay their own expenses.
- (3) Staff of the Division of Children's Medical Services Prevention and Intervention shall be assigned by the director to provide support to the task force.
- (4) The task force shall collect data from all states operating infant screening programs. All necessary research shall be completed by August 1, 2002.
- shall prepare recommendations regarding the newborn infant screening requirement provided in section 383.14, Florida

 Statutes, and develop a newborn infant screening plan tailored to the needs of Florida's population. As part of the review of current screening requirements and in the formulation of its recommended plan, the task force shall consider the cost of current testing, the cost of expansion, appropriate mechanisms for reimbursing the cost of testing, and the appropriate location for such testing.
- (6) The task force shall submit a final report of its review and recommended plan to the Secretary of Health, the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by September 1, 2002.
