1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to the Fuel Tax Collection 3 Trust Fund; amending ss. 206.606, 206.608, 4 F.S.; revising the distribution of certain tax 5 proceeds that have been deposited in the trust 6 fund; increasing the amount to be distributed 7 to the State Game Trust Fund; revising the uses of such proceeds; providing an effective date. 8 9 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 11 12 Section 1. Section 206.606, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 13 206.606 Distribution of certain proceeds.--14 (1) Moneys collected pursuant to ss. 206.41(1)(g) and 15 16 206.87(1)(e) shall be deposited in the Fuel Tax Collection 17 Trust Fund. Such moneys, after deducting the service charges imposed by s. 215.20, the refunds granted pursuant to s. 18 19 206.41, and the administrative costs incurred by the department in collecting, administering, enforcing, and 20 21 distributing the tax, which administrative costs may not 22 exceed 2 percent of collections, shall be distributed monthly to the State Transportation Trust Fund, except that: 23 (a) \$6.30 million shall be transferred to the 24 Department of Environmental Protection in each fiscal year and 25 deposited in the Invasive Plant Control Trust Fund to be used 26 27 for aquatic plant management, including nonchemical control of 28 aquatic weeds, research into nonchemical controls, and 29 enforcement activities. Beginning in fiscal year 1993-1994, 30 the department shall allocate at least \$1 million of such funds to the eradication of melaleuca.

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- (b) \$12\$2.5 million shall be transferred to the State Game Trust Fund in the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission in each fiscal year and used for recreational boating activities, and freshwater fisheries management and research. The transfers must be made in equal monthly amounts beginning on July 1 of each fiscal year. The commission shall annually determine where unmet needs exist for boating-related activities, and may fund such activities in counties where, due to the number of vessel registrations, sufficient financial resources are unavailable.
- A minimum of $$6$\frac{1.25}{million}$ million shall be used to fund local projects to provide recreational channel marking, public launching facilities, aquatic plant control, and other local boating related activities. In funding the projects, the commission shall give priority consideration as follows:
- Unmet needs in counties that have with populations of 100,000 or less.
- b. Unmet needs in coastal counties that have with a high level of boating-related boating related activities that involve from individuals who reside residing in other counties.
- The remaining\$6\$1.25 million may be used for recreational boating activities and freshwater fisheries management and research.
- 3. The commission is authorized to adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to implement a Florida Boating Improvement Program similar to the program administered by the Department of Environmental Protection and established in rules 62D-5.031 - 62D-5.036, Florida Administrative Code, to determine projects eligible for 31 funding under this subsection.

On February 1 of each year, the commission shall file an annual report with the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives outlining the status of its Florida Boating Improvement Program, including the projects funded, and a list of counties whose needs are unmet due to insufficient financial resources from vessel registration fees.

- (c) 0.65 percent of moneys collected pursuant to s. 206.41(1)(g) shall be transferred to the Agricultural Emergency Eradication Trust Fund.
- (2) Not less than 10 percent of the moneys deposited in the State Transportation Trust Fund pursuant to this section shall be allocated by the Department of Transportation for public transit and rail capital projects, including service development projects, as defined in s. 341.031(7) and (8), unless otherwise provided in the General Appropriations Act.

Section 2. Section 206.608, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

206.608 State Comprehensive Enhanced Transportation System Tax; deposit of proceeds; distribution.--Moneys received pursuant to ss. 206.41(1)(f) and 206.87(1)(d) shall be deposited in the Fuel Tax Collection Trust Fund, and, after deducting the service charge imposed in chapter 215 and administrative costs incurred by the department in collecting, administering, enforcing, and distributing the tax, which administrative costs may not exceed 2 percent of collections, shall be distributed as follows:

(1) Ten million dollars shall be transferred to the State Game Trust Fund in the Fish and Wildlife Conservation

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Commission in each fiscal year and used for recreational boating activities and for freshwater fisheries management and research. The transfers must be made in equal monthly amounts beginning on July 1 of each fiscal year. The commission shall annually determine where unmet needs exist for boating-related activities and may fund such activities in counties where, due to the number of vessel registrations, sufficient financial resources are unavailable.

- 1. A minimum of \$5 million shall be used to fund local projects to provide recreational channel marking, public launching facilities, aquatic plant control, and other local boating-related activities. In funding the projects, the commission shall give priority in the following order:
- a. To unmet needs in counties that have populations of 100,000 or less.
- To unmet needs in coastal counties that have a high level of boating-related activities involving individuals who reside in other counties.
- 2. The remaining \$5 million may be used for recreational boating activities and freshwater fisheries management and research.
- (2) (1) 0.65 percent of the proceeds of the tax levied pursuant to s. 206.41(1)(f) shall be transferred to the Agricultural Emergency Eradication Trust Fund.
- (3) (3) The remaining proceeds of the taxes $\frac{\tan x}{\tan x}$ levied pursuant to ss.s.206.41(1)(f) and all of the proceeds from the tax imposed by s.206.87(1)(d) shall be transferred into the State Transportation Trust Fund, and may be used only for projects in the adopted work program in the district in which the tax proceeds are collected and, to the maximum extent 31 | feasible, such moneys shall be programmed for use in the

county where collected. However, no revenue from the taxes imposed pursuant to ss. 206.41(1)(f) and 206.87(1)(d) in a county shall be expended unless the projects funded with such revenues have been included in the work program adopted pursuant to s. 339.135.
