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17	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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19	Section 1. Subsection (3) and paragraph (b) of
20	subsection (19) of section 320.08058, Florida Statutes, as
21	amended by chapter 2001-355, Laws of Florida, are amended to
22	read:
23	320.08058 Specialty license plates
24	(3) COLLEGIATE LICENSE PLATES
25	(a) The department shall develop a collegiate license
26	plate as provided in this section for state and independent
27	universities domiciled in this state. However, any collegiate
28	license plate created or established after October 1, 2002
29	January 1, 1997 , must comply with the requirements of s.
30	320.08053 and be specifically authorized by an act of the
31	Legislature. Collegiate license plates must bear the colors
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and design approved by the department as appropriate for each
state and independent university. The word "Florida" must be
stamped across the bottom of the plate in small letters.

4 (b) A collegiate plate annual use fee is to be 5 distributed to the state or independent university foundation б designated by the purchaser for deposit in an unrestricted 7 account. The Board of Regents shall require each state 8 university to submit a plan for approval of the expenditure of 9 all funds so designated. These funds may be used only for 10 academic enhancement, including scholarships and private 11 fundraising activities.

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(19) SEA TURTLE LICENSE PLATES.--

13 (b) The first \$500,000 in annual use fees shall be 14 deposited in the Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund in 15 the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and. The first 16 \$500,000 in annual revenue shall be used by the Florida Marine 17 Turtle Protection Program to conduct sea turtle protection, research, and recovery programs. The next \$215,000 in annual 18 19 use fees shall be distributed to the Caribbean Conservation 20 Corporation, located in Gainesville, to fund sea turtle research and education programs that benefit Florida sea 21 turtles. The Caribbean Conservation Corporation shall annually 22 distribute assigned funds through a Sea Turtle Grants Program 23 24 that supports sea turtle research and education activities of 25 Florida-based nonprofit groups, educational institutions, and Florida coastal counties. The Caribbean Conservation 26 Corporation shall write and publish procedures for submitting 27 28 grant applications and criteria for allocating available 29 funds, and shall appoint a technical advisory committee, 30 composed of at least five members, including two 31 representatives from the Fish and Wildlife Conservation

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1 Commission, to select grant recipients from proposals submitted by eligible entities. Any additional annual revenue 2 3 shall be distributed as follows: 70 percent shall be deposited in the Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund and used by 4 5 the Florida Marine Turtle Protection Program for sea turtle б conservation activities; and 30 percent shall be assigned to 7 the Caribbean Conservation Corporation for distribution 8 through the Sea Turtle Grants Program. Up to 15 percent of the funds distributed to the Caribbean Conservation Corporation 9 10 may be expended for administrative costs directly associated 11 with the grants program. Up to 10 percent of the funds distributed to the Caribbean Conservation Corporation may be 12 used to promote and market the Sea Turtle license plate. None 13 of the funds received by the Caribbean Conservation 14 Corporation from the Sea Turtle license plate or the Sea 15 Turtle Grants Program, nor funds received by any grant 16 17 recipients of the Sea Turtle Grants Program, may be used for purposes of litigation. Additional license plate revenue, up 18 19 to an amount not exceeding 30 percent of the total annual 20 revenue, shall be dispersed annually through the marine turtle grants program as provided in s. 370.12(1)(h). The remaining 21 22 annual use proceeds shall be used by the Florida Marine Turtle Protection Program for sea turtle conservation activities. 23 24 Section 2. Paragraph (h) of subsection (1) of section 25 370.12, Florida Statutes, is repealed effective June 30, 2003. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002. 26 27 28 29 30 31
