Requiring a quorum to be present before a vote may be taken by the school advisory council. A majority of the 21 22 membership of the council constitutes a quorum. 23 2. Requiring at least 3-days' advance notice in writing to all members of the advisory council of any matter 24 25 that is scheduled to come before the council for a vote. 26 3. Scheduling meetings when parents, students, 27 teachers, business persons, and members of the community can 28 attend. 29 4. Replacing any member who has two unexcused 30 consecutive absences from a school advisory council meeting that is noticed according to the procedures in the bylaws. 31 1

The district school board may review all proposed bylaws of a school advisory council annually and shall maintain a record of minutes of council meetings. б Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002.
