- (2) The Commissioner of Education shall grant the discretionary spending authority under this section for a period of one fiscal year to any school district that submits a request for such spending authority to the commissioner prior to the convening of the initial allocation conference under s. 236.078, provided that at least one of the following eliqibility requirements is met:
- (a) The school district has earned a district
  performance grade of "A" or "B" as determined pursuant to s.
  229.57(16).
- (b) The school district has no school within the district with a school performance grade below the grade of "B" as determined pursuant to s. 229.57(8).
- (c) The school district has been granted deregulated status pursuant to s. 228.0565.
- (d) The school district has submitted, with the request for discretionary spending authority, a plan that establishes improvement goals for low-performing schools within the district. The plan must include:
  - 1. The number and type of schools within the district.
- $\underline{\text{2.}}$  The performance grades for each school within the district.
- 3. The number of schools within the district with a performance grade of "D" or "F" that the district intends to improve at least one letter grade during the year in which discretionary spending authority is granted.
- (3) In reporting its expenditures under s. 237.34, a school district granted discretionary spending authority under this section shall report on a school-by-school and a

district-aggregate basis how all funds, including federal funds, allocated to the district for formula-funded categorical programs were expended. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002. HOUSE SUMMARY Authorizes school districts to opt out of the restrictions applied to allocations for formula-funded categorical programs and to use such funds at their discretion.
