licensed insurance agents, their insurers or insurers to which

involved in the crash, their legal representatives, their

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such insurers to provide claims or underwriting information, prosecutorial authorities, radio and television stations 3 licensed by the Federal Communications Commission, newspapers qualified to publish legal notices under ss. 50.011 and 4 5 50.031, and free newspapers of general circulation, published once a week or more often, available and of interest to the 6 7 public generally for the dissemination of news. For the 8 purposes of this section, the following products or publications are not newspapers as referred to in this section: those intended primarily for members of a particular 10 11 profession or occupational group; those with the primary 12 purpose of distributing advertising; and those with the 13 primary purpose of publishing names and other personally 14 identifying information concerning parties to motor vehicle crashes. Any local, state, or federal agency, agent, or 15 16 employee that is authorized to have access to such reports by any provision of law shall be granted such access in the 17 furtherance of the agency's statutory duties notwithstanding 18 19 the provisions of this paragraph. Any local, state, or federal 20 agency, agent, or employee receiving such crash reports shall maintain the confidential and exempt status of those reports, 21 22 and shall not disclose such crash reports to any person or entity. Any person attempting to access crash reports within 23 60 days after the date the report is filed must present 24 25 legitimate credentials or identification that demonstrates his 26 or her qualifications to access that information. This 27 exemption is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act 28 of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, unless reviewed and saved from repeal 29 through reenactment by the Legislature. 30 31

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
