Subsections (1) and (2) of section 322.051, 7 Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 8 322.051 Identification cards.--9 (1) Any person who is 12 years of age or older, or any 10 person who has a disability, regardless of age, who applies 11 for a disabled parking permit under s. 320.0848, may be issued an identification card by the department upon completion of an 12 13 application and payment of an application fee. (a) Each such application shall include the following 14 information regarding the applicant: 15 1. Full name (first, middle or maiden, and last), 16 17 gender, social security card number, residence and mailing 18 address, country of birth, and a brief description. 19 2. Proof of birth date satisfactory to the department. 20 Proof of identity satisfactory to the department. 3. 21 Such proof must include one of the following documents issued 22 to the applicant: unless a. A driver's license record or identification card 23 24 record from another jurisdiction that required the applicant 25 to submit a document for identification which is substantially similar to a document required under sub-subparagraph b., 26 27 sub-subparagraph c., sub-subparagraph d., sub-subparagraph e., 28 or sub-subparagraph f.; has already been established: 29 b. Proof of nonimmigrant classification provided by 5 the United States Department of Justice, for an original б identification card. 7 (b) An application for an identification card must be 8 signed and verified by the applicant in a format designated by 9 the department before a person authorized to administer oaths. 10 The fee for an identification card is \$3, including payment 11 for the color photograph or digital image of the applicant. (c) Each such applicant may include fingerprints and 12 13 any other unique biometric means of identity. 14 (2)(a) Every identification card shall expire, unless canceled earlier, on the fourth birthday of the applicant 15 following the date of original issue. However, if an 16 17 individual is 60 years of age or older, and has an identification card issued under this section, the card shall 18 19 not expire unless done so by cancellation by the department or by the death of the cardholder. Renewal of any identification 20 card shall be made for a term which shall expire on the fourth 21 birthday of the applicant following expiration of the 22 identification card renewed, unless surrendered earlier. Any 23 24 application for renewal received later than 90 days after expiration of the identification card shall be considered the 25 same as an application for an original identification card. 26 27 The renewal fee for an identification card shall be \$3. The department shall, at the end of 4 years and 6 months after the 28 29 issuance or renewal of an identification card, destroy any record of the card if it has expired and has not been renewed, 30 31 unless the cardholder is 60 years of age or older.

Subsections (1) and (6) of section 322.212, 12 Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 13 322.212 Unauthorized possession of, and other unlawful 14 acts in relation to, driver's license or identification 15 16 card.--17 (1) It is unlawful for any person to: (a) Knowingly to have in his or her possession or to 18 19 display any blank, forged, stolen, fictitious, counterfeit, or 20 unlawfully issued driver's license or identification card or any instrument in the similitude of a driver's license or 21 22 identification card unless possession by such person has been duly authorized by the department; 23 24 (b) Knowingly to have in his or her possession any instrument in the similitude of a driver's license issued by 25 the department or its duly authorized agents or those of any 26 state or jurisdiction issuing licenses recognized in this 27 28 state for the operation of a motor vehicle; or 29 (c) Knowingly to have in his or her possession any instrument in the similitude of an identification card issued 30 31 by the department or its duly authorized agents or those of 8

A 10 violation of this paragraph may be investigated by any law 11 enforcement agency, including the Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco. 12 13 The term "driver's license" includes a driver's license issued 14 15 by the department or its agents or a driver's license issued by any state or jurisdiction that issues licenses recognized 16 17 in this state for the operation of a motor vehicle. The term "identification card" includes any identification card issued 18 19 by the department or its agents or any identification card 20 issued by any state or jurisdiction that issues identification cards recognized in this state for the purpose of indicating a 21 person's true name and age. This subsection does not prohibit 22 a person from possessing or displaying another person's 23 24 driver's license or identification card for a lawful purpose. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, 25 (6) any person who violates any of the provisions of this section 26 27 is guilty of a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. However, 28 29 Any person who violates paragraph (5)(a) by giving a false age in any application for a driver's license or identification 30 31 card or who violates paragraph (5)(b) by possessing a driver's

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license, identification card, or any instrument in the similitude thereof, on which the date of birth has been altered is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. Any person who violates paragraph (1)(d) commits a felony of the second б degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. Section 7. This act shall take effect October 1, 2002. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SB 520 This CS provides that driver licenses issued to individuals who rely on an alien registration receipt card (green card) to establish proof of identity shall expire in accordance with existing renewal periods. The CS provides that driver licenses issued to individuals who rely on certain identification documents issued by the United States Department of Justice to establish proof of identity shall expire 4 years from the date of issuance or upon the expiration date reflected on the appropriate Department of Justice document, whichever occurs first. Applicable licensees may not renew except in person and upon submission of the applicable identification documentation. The CS also conforms requirements for replacement or duplicate licenses, and name and address changes. and address changes. The CS authorizes the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to incorporate fingerprints and other unique biometric means of identity into the application for driver licenses and identification cards.
