I. Summary:

This bill provides for the issuance of a Pearl Harbor Survivor or Purple Heart license plate to certain disabled veterans without payment of the required license tax.

This bill substantially amends section 320.089 of the Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

Currently, s. 320.089(1), F.S., provides that Florida residents who are active duty or retired National Guard members, active duty U.S. Armed Forces Reservists, former Prisoners of War (POW), or Pearl Harbor Survivors and Purple Heart recipients, may purchase license plates having their military affiliation stamped on the license plate in the following manner: “National Guard”, “Pearl Harbor Survivor”, “Combat-Wounded Veteran”, “U.S. Reserve”, and “Purple Heart”. The cost to these purchasers includes the fees as established in ss. 320.06 and 320.08, F.S.

Section 320.084, F.S., allows for one free motor vehicle license plate to be issued to disabled veterans who have been a resident of the state for the last 5 years and who were honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces. At the time of application, the applicant must present proof that his or her vehicle was acquired through financial assistance by the Department of Veterans Affairs and they have a 100 percent service connected disability rating.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill amends s. 320.089, F.S., to provide for the issuance of a Pearl Harbor Survivor or Purple Heart motor vehicle license plate, without cost to a person who also qualifies for a disabled veteran’s license plate. There shall be a \$2.50 service charge retained by the Tax

Collector in accordance with the provisions of s. 320.04, F.S, for each initial application or renewal of registration and a fifty cent reflectorization fee for the license plate as provided in s. 320.06(3)(b), F.S. Registration under this section shall be renewed annually during the applicable renewal period on forms prescribed by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles.

This bill will have minimal impact on license tax revenues assuming that qualifying disabled veterans only receive one free license plate. This bill will also require \$7,560 for contracted programming modifications to the Motor Vehicles Software System.

V. Economic Impact and Fiscal Note:

A. Tax/Fee Issues:

B. Private Sector Impact:

Pearl Harbor Survivor or Purple Heart license plate recipients who qualify for a disabled veteran's license plate would not pay an annual license tax fee.

C. Government Sector Impact:

The Department estimates the bill will require \$7,560 for contracted programming modifications to the Motor Vehicles Software System.

The Department estimates that revenue loss associated with this bill will be minimal.

VI. Technical Deficiencies:

VII. Related Issues:

The Department indicated that during the period 2000-2001, there were 13,942 Purple Heart license plate transactions, and 724 Pearl Harbor Survivor license plate transactions. In 2000, the Department estimated that there were approximately 12,000 disabled veteran plates in circulation.

VIII. Amendments:
